

# Burdette, Turley Put Braves Yanks Back on Path To Series

The "magic number" for the New York Yankees is 23, and for the Chicago White Sox that means "23-skidoo."

The Yankees' 6-3 victory over the White Sox Thursday means that the Yanks can clinch the American league pennant by winning 23 of their remaining 33 games. Or any combination of Yankee wins and Chicago losses adding to 23 will do it.

In the National league, the Milwaukee Braves, with a 6½ game lead, also have 33 to play. But their "magic number" for a pennant clinching is 23.

Law Burdette and Bob Turley, two money players who probably would pitch the opening game, have the Braves and Yankees back on the high road to the World Series.

Just when the comfortable league leads of both teams seemed in danger, Burdette sent the Braves 6½ games in front in the National league when he whipped the Los Angeles Dodgers, 4-0 Thursday night and Turley turned back the surging Chicago White Sox, 6-3, to put the Yankees 11½ ahead in the American.

Burdette, who doled out four hits to the Dodgers, now has won eight games since the All-Star game. Turley allowed six Chicago hits in gaining his 18th victory of the year, tops in the majors and an all-time career high for him.

Darien, Conn. — (UPI) — Defending champion Joanne Gunderson of Seattle and 1954 titleholder Barbara Romack of Sacramento, Calif., were favored today to gain the final round of the National Women's Amateur golf championship against two of their Curtis Cup teammates.

For 18-year-old Joanne today's 18-hole semi-final meant another struggle with her rival from her home state. 21-year-old Anne Quast of Marysville, Wash., whom she has downed twice in three previous meetings.

Miss Romack, on the road back, met Meriam Bailey of Palatine, Ill. Best Game Joanne played her best golf of the tournament Thursday in reaching the semi-finals with a 2 and 1 victory over her victim in last year's final. Anne Casey Johnstone of Mason City, Ia.

Up to then, Miss Gunderson had been playing only well enough to stay alive. She sprayed her shots Thursday morning in a 3 and 1 victory over Toronto school teacher Rosemary Neundorf.

Miss Romack had a breeze in racking up her two victories. She bumped Mrs. George Valentine of Perth, Scotland, last of the invading Britishers, 4 and 3, and walloped Berridge Long of Huntington, W. Va., 6 and 4.

# Bob Smith Annexes RVL Batting Title; Top Clubs to Play

Bob Smith, Camp White, was confirmed as Rogue Valley league batting champion today by the release of official statistics and records for the season.

Smith had 10 hits in 20 times up for a .500 average, according to the tabulation by League President Harry Chipman. At least 16 times at bat were needed to be qualified for batting title consideration.

Riddle, champion during the regular season, claimed team swatting honors with .310 for the eight-game outing.

Winner of the top pitcher trophy will be determined at a league meeting Sunday following the completion of the RVL playoff at Cave Junction. Duane Miller, Riddle, with a 5-1 mark, has won the most games this season and has been the most worked mound toiler with his 53 innings.

Riddle-CJ Vis Riddle and Cave Junction, No. 2 finishers, play for the second season trophy in a two-of-three series. First game will be at 4:30 p.m. Saturday at Myrtle Creek. Second game will be at 1 p.m. Sunday at Cave Junction with third game, if needed, to follow.

Bob Clark, Butte Falls, who got four hits in five times up last Sunday, was runner-up for individual batting honors with .440. Dick James, Riddle, .405, was the only

other player over .400. Smith tied the official league record average established by Ron Maurer, Cave Junction, last year. Maurer was fourth in the final tabulations for 1958 with .394.

Cave Junction was second in team batting with .289. Camp White had .281, Butte Falls .265 and Prospect .181.

If Griffith really wants to move his club to Minneapolis—which Thursday he refused to deny—he may have to move fast before the Indians beat him to the punch.

If he decides he does want to move, he may have lots of trouble getting a vote of approval from the league and, in addition, may incur the wrath of Congress.

If Griffith asks the American League for permission to move to Minneapolis, he could draw negative votes not only from the Indians but also from the New York Yankees and the Boston Red Sox.
