

Fishermen Find Lost 9-Year-Old

Porterville, Calif.—A barefoot 9-year-old Mojave, Calif., boy, missing 33 hours in the High Sierras, was found alive "and in good health" last night by two fishermen.

Tulare county Sheriff Sandy Robinson said the boy, George Miller, wandered into the camp of the two men at the junction of the Kern river and Cottonwood creek.

Fishermen Bob Jones and Lester Hutson said he came to their camp site, some 20 miles from Johnsondale where he was separated from his parents Friday. They turned him over to rangers from the Sequoia National forest.

Robinson said the parents, Mr. and Mrs. Louis H. Miller, would probably see their son again at a Porterville hospital, where the rangers planned to take him.

An area-wide search began after George turned up missing, but quickly centered around the rugged Kern river canyon when it appeared he was following the river downstream.

Although lightly clad, George was in good condition. Temperatures were mild and he was able to make more than a mile an hour on his trek, Robinson said.

The measure provides for Federal purchase of that portion of the vast timber stand that is not bought by private interests. The bill was sponsored by Sen. Richard L. Neuberger (D-Ore.) after it was introduced at the administration's request.

Columbus, Ohio—Dr. Leo A. Estel, chief physical anthropologist at Ohio State University, didn't go to college until he was 45.

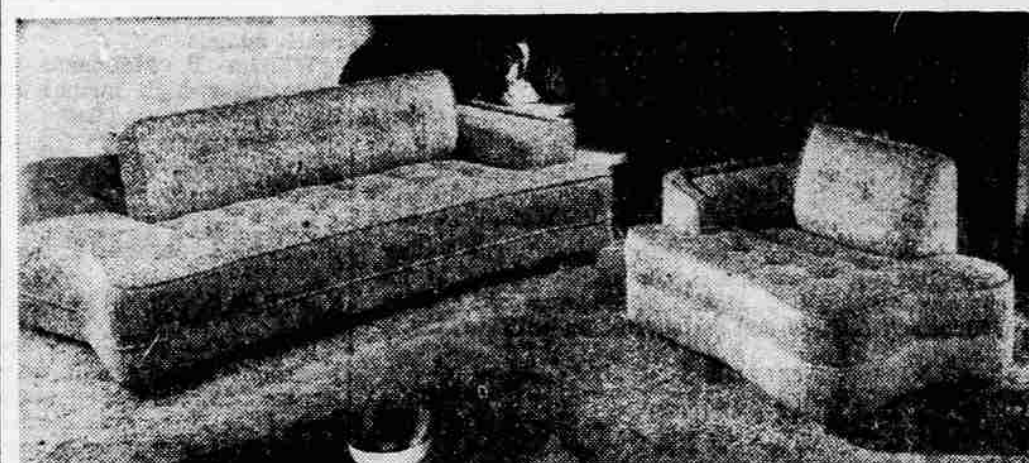
Daughters Follow Example of Mothers

Teamster Officials Escape Indictments

Portland — Circuit Judge James R. Bain Friday dismissed two perjury indictments against Teamster union officials Clyde C. Crosby and Frank E. Malloy on motion of the attorney general's office. Assistant Attorney General Arthur Higgs told the court there was insufficient evidence to prosecute the charges which grew out of the Portland vice investigation.

The dismissals brought to 92 the number of cases thrown out for lack of evidence out of 116 indictments returned in the marathon probe into the city's underworld. The state has won one conviction and got one guilty plea since the campaign started and 18 indictments remain to be prosecuted.
