

# Giants Take 3-2 Win From Dodgers

San Francisco - (UPI) - Jim Davenport, whose specialty is the pop fly, smashed two home runs against his "cousins" from Los Angeles Saturday to lead the Giants to a 3-2 victory over the Dodgers in the first game of a day-night doubleheader.

The light-hitting third baseman raised his total to 10 for the season and five of them at the expense of Los Angeles hurling as he connected for bases-empty blows in the first and third innings.

Ruben Gomez, who won his eighth of the season with an assist from Al Worthington, had a three-hit shutout on the fire going into the ninth. But then he gave up a single to John Roseboro, and Duke Snider followed with his 12th home run of the season into the leftfield stands to cut the Giants' lead to one run.

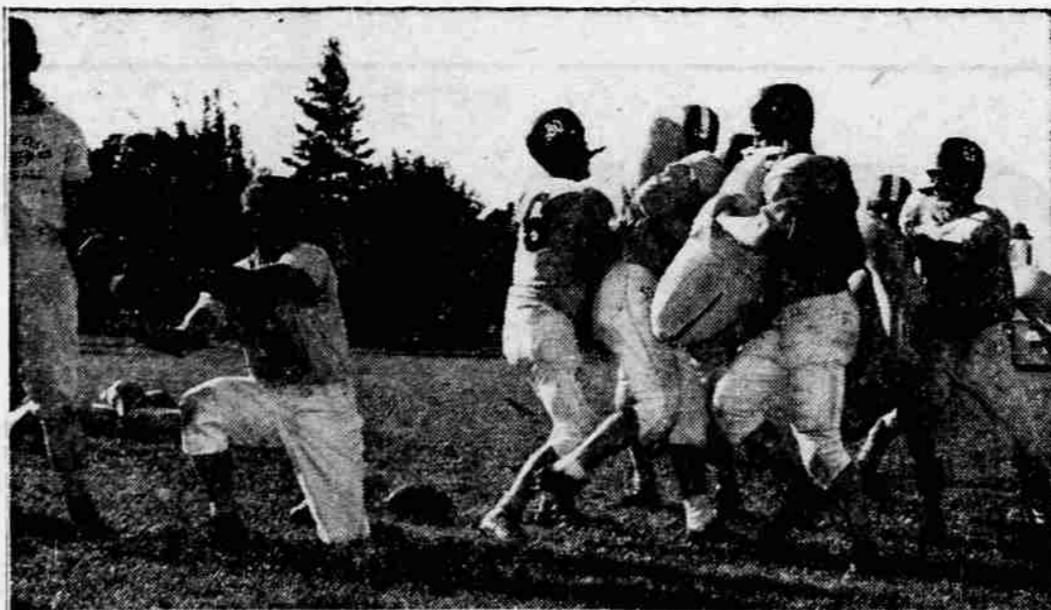
After Gomez then retired Carl Furillo on a fly to right for the second out, he was hoisted after first baseman Orlando Cepeda booted Norm

Larker's hard grounder for an error. Worthington got Gil Hodges to fly out to Whitey Lockman in left for the game's final out.

San Francisco made short work of Danny McDevitt in the first inning after the southpaw had fanned Felipe Alou to open the frame. Davenport followed with a homer into the leftfield stands and another run came across as Willie Mays tripled to right and scored on Jackie Brandt's double to left center.

McDevitt, who has failed to go the distance in five lifetime starts against the Giants, left the game with his sixth defeat against two victories. Babe Birrer took over for him and in the third inning gave up Davenport's second home run, a 400-foot smash over the left center field barrier.

The teams then knocked off for dinner and were scheduled to resume here tonight with Johnny Podres (12-10) going against the Giants' Mike McCormick (9-7) in a battle of southpaws.

## Browns Nip Rams 13-10

Pittsburgh - (UPI) - The Chicago Bears unleashed a running attack for a pair of touchdowns in the second period and George Blanda added a clinching field goal in the fourth quarter Saturday for a 17-10 victory over the Pittsburgh Steelers in a charity exhibition game.

United Press International After five years of futility, the Cleveland Browns finally won an exhibition game in California.

Old pro Lou (The Toe) Groza kicked a 50-yard field goal with 15 seconds remaining to give the Browns a 13-10 triumph over the Los Angeles Rams Friday night.

In Friday night's other exhibition games, the Washington Redskins whipped the Baltimore Colts, 27-7, and the Detroit Lions downed the New York Giants, 26-7.

Two touchdowns by half-back Sid Watson paced the Redskins to their first triumph of the exhibition season. Lennie Moore scored Baltimore's lone TD on a 42-yard scamper.

Yale Lary and Jim David scored on intercepted passes in the second half to set up Detroit's easy victory over the Giants.

## Restless Wind Takes Photo Win

Restless Wind defeated Winsome Winner in a photo finish Saturday to capture the \$164,725 Washington Futurity at Arlington Park, richest at two-year-old race ever run in Illinois.

Restless Wind equalled the record of 1:09 3/5 for the six-furlong event as he won by a neck. The time was 4/5 of a second short of the track record held by Hill Gail.

In other Saturday feature races, Outer Space won the \$29,600 Vagrancy Handicap at Belmont Park and Tudor Era triumphed in the \$28,593 Olympic Handicap at Atlantic City.

Restless Wind, owned by Lianglong farm, carried top weight of 122 pounds, the same impost toled by Swoon's Son when he set the event record in 1955. It was Restless Wind's seventh win in 10 starts and earned a net purse of \$112,225. He paid \$5.00, \$3.20 and \$2.50. Winsome Winner, a 64-1 shot, returned \$39.00 and \$14.80. Demobilize, who finished three and one half lengths behind, paid \$8.20.

Mrs. Gerald S. Smith's Outer Space moved through the pack in the stretch to score a length victory over Mile Dianne in the Vagrancy cap. A length further back was Alanesian, coupled with Outer Space in the betting. Searching, the favorite, finished fourth.

Jockey Eldon Nelson found a hole in the pack while rounding into the homestretch and guided Outer Space from fifth to the lead. He rode her along the rail to win in 1:23 4/5, her third stakes triumph of the year.

Outer Space paid \$5.60, \$3.20 and \$3.20 as she picked up a winner's purse of \$18,940. Mile Dianne returned \$9.80 and \$6.80 and Alanesian paid \$3.20.

At Atlantic City, Tudor Era took the lead from the start and was never headed as he defeated Amber Diver by three lengths in a prelude for the \$100,000 United Nations Handicap Sept. 13. Jockey Joe Culmore had Tudor Era a length and a half ahead of Amber Diver at the stretch and finished the trip in 1:52 1/5. One-Eyed King was third.

Tudor Era paid \$6.20, \$3.60 and \$3.00 across the board. Amber Diver returned \$7.00 and \$4.60, while One-Eyed King paid \$4.00.

# Fastest Driver Sets New Speed Record

Bonneville Salt Flats, Utah - (UPI) - The fastest living American driver, Mickey Thompson of El Monte, Calif., Saturday officially set a record of 266.866 miles per hour in his class E Streamliner at the Bonneville speed trials.

Thompson raced his two-engine car to a speed of 272.31 mph on the Western Utah Salt Flats Friday to become America's fastest driver. But it was not an official record because it was a one-way run.

Officials of the Southern California Timing association explained that records must be set in two-way runs through the measured mile.

The old record was 266.204 mph set here last year by Roy Leslie of Denver. Leslie also had a speed of 270 mph in a one-way run.

Nine other records were set on the Great Salt Lake speed course today-eight of them by California drivers.

Louis Ashby of Odessa, Tex., was the only non-Californian to set a record as his 1957 Buick hit 147.905 mph in the Class D couple-sevan gasoline division.

Other records were: Tom Beatty, Sun Valley, Calif., 229.679 mph in Class D lakester division; Bob Bequette, Los Angeles, 208.152 mph in Class C modified roadster; Ed Souhard, Torrance, Calif., 162.607 mph in Class C modified sportscar; Jim Lindsley, Bell, Calif., 159.117 mph in Class D roadster gasoline division; Vernon Brink, San Francisco, 181.380 mph in Class C roadster; Harold Johansen, Saugus, Calif., 141.829 mph in Class A modified roadster; Tony Waters, Bakersfield, Calif., 199.669 mph in Class D roadster; and Bob Summers, Pomona, Calif., 221.062 mph in Class D modified roadster.
