Four Children Die In Apartment Fire

Nyak, N. Y.—UPH—Four children died in a fire Thursday night while their parents were away.

The youngsters were Hayer Harris Jr., 4; Betty Lou, 2; Darcia, 1; and Robin, 2 months. The fire swept their apartment in a four-family frame house.

Mrs. Harris was visiting a neighbor when the blaze broke out. Her husband had left the apartment earlier.

Five Active Gold Mines in County

There are five active gold mines and two non-metal mines currently in operation in Jackson county, according to a report just released by the state department of geology and mineral industries.

Two of the gold mines are lode mines and the other three are the placer type and are generally operated on a seasonal basis. The non-metal operations include a crushed granite and quartz mine run by F. I. Bristol of Rogue River, and a plant operated by the Gas-Ice corporation of Portland, where minerals used in manufacturing dry ice are extracted.

In 1957 Oregon's mineral industries increased 25 per cent in value over the previous year and amounted to nearly \$42.5 million. Jackson county produced \$3,164,000 in minerals, or 7.5 per cent of the minerals produced in the state.

Josephine and Klamath counties lagged behind with only \$930,000 and \$225,000 worth of minerals produced, but Douglas county more than doubled the local output, producing nearly 17.5 per cent of the minerals in the state.

Among the metals whose production was increased last year were mercury, up 111 per cent, and gold, 23 per cent.

Recurrent Pancreatitis

One of the rarer diseases of the upper part of the abdomen, and one that is often

hard to be sure of is pancreatitis. The acute form of the disease can be very severe and productive of shock. The chronic relapsing form of the disease is the one that bothers a few people. The disease is rare. Unfortunately, the clinical picture is not so clear-cut that a physician can often recognize the story when he hears it. Unfortunately, also, x-ray studies seldom help unless the person happens to have a lot of small stones in his pancreas. Usually, the man has spells of pain with, in between, some indigestion, perhaps with diarrhea. The pain is in the upper part of the abdomen and tends to go straight through to the back. With it, there may be nausea and vomiting.

In perhaps half the cases the trouble follows disease in the gallbladder and the bile ducts. It is thought that some bile flows into the pancreas—which is the large digestive gland behind the stomach. The pain may come an hour or two after eating. The patient may get some relief by crouching over, perhaps with his hands around his knees. His stools may be greasy.

In perhaps one in five cases, the disease will injure the insulin-producing cells sufficiently so that the person becomes diabetic, and this fact helps in the diagnosis. One of the best signs of pancreatitis, when an attack flares up, is a marked rise in the blood serum of a substance called amylase. This is normally produced by the pancreas and it serves to digest starches.

There are many treatments for pancreatitis, and the fact that there are so many means

that, as yet, we physicians do not know just what will most surely stop the flareups from coming. Often large doses of pancreatin are given with the hope of improving digestion in the bowel. Many different operations have been tried out, but I doubt if the ideal one has yet been found.
