

Restoration of 40 Acres Announced

Portland — The restoration of 40 acres of public land from a power project in the Deschutes National forest has been announced today by Virgil T. Heath, Oregon state supervisor of the bureau of land management, Portland. The lands are about 30 miles west of Highway 97 between Madras and Bend in the southwest corner of Jefferson county on the Metolius river.

Miss Mavis Strom, Medford, won a red ribbon for her skill in the 4-H sewing contest.

Miss Joyce Kitsenbeker, of Central Point, and Miss Carolyn Tiegs, Talent, entered champions in the poultry show. Miss Kitsenbeker exhibited the champion pair of New Hampshire pullets and Miss Tiegs had the champion pair of White Leghorn pullets. Flash Floods Hit Towns in Kansas

Concordia, Kan. — Flash floods touched off by rains up to 10 inches swept through at least a half dozen Kansas towns Thursday night, doing major damage at Clyde where the entire business district and two-thirds of the residences were inundated.

Water reached depths of six feet in the business district of Clyde and strong currents caved in store fronts, upended sidewalks and washed out railroad tracks.

No one was reported killed in the floods, which struck their heaviest blow in the middle of the night.

Teacher Added to Rogue Academy Due to Enrollemnt

For the first time in the history of Rogue River academy, Seventh-day Adventist denominational school on South Stage rd., the large enrollment in the first and second grades will make it necessary to have a teacher for each of the two grades, according to Fred Wilbur, school principal.

Mrs. A. E. Merkel, who taught the first and second grades last year has been handling 37 youngsters in an overcrowded room, with the assistance of Mrs. James Wood, since school opened Sept. 2.

Another room is being renovated and will be ready for occupancy by the 19 second graders early this week. Mrs. Dewey Penrod will be added to the teaching staff as second grade teacher.

Teachers Hired
Wilbur noted that at the school's inception in 1926 only two teachers were hired for the first eight grades, but for a number of years there has been one teacher for every two grades in the grade school section.

The school, which maintained 12 grades until the opening of the new boarding academy

near Milo, Ore., three years ago, had students in only nine grades last year. This year, however, it will be a full 10 grade junior academy with 10 students in each of the ninth and 10th grades, and several more expected to enroll within the next two weeks, according to Wilbur.

The increased student load has made it necessary to add two members to the upper classes teaching staff. Mrs. H. C. Chilson will have charge of the English department, and Mrs. James Wood will head up the girls' physical education section.

Wilbur stated that students have enrolled in the school this year from as far away as Eagle Point and Shady Cove.
