Six years ago we found ourselves in very serious financial straits and went to live with a bachelor uncle of my husband's. Consensus Seems To Be Against Congress Increasing Tax Rates

WALZER UPI Financial Editor New York - (UPI) - With all the inflation talk going around, the question arises whether or not attempts will be made to increase taxes when Congress re-assembles. The treasury department doesn't talk about taxes. But many others in Washington do, and the consensus seems to be against a rise because there isn't much more tax that can be wrung from the people or from corporations. Of course, if a war came along the tax rates would rise immediately, the experts point out. They say they don't expect war. Some economists hold that taxes are deflationary - that they sop up excess purchasing power. But in the past the higher taxes have been followed by wage increases to bring the personal incomes up and prices have been raised to compensate for the higher rates levied against corporations. Hence the argument that taxes are more inflationary than they are deflationary. Lots of Talk There is bound to be a lot of tax talk when Congress returns. There'll be pressure for a reduction. Also there'll be more moves to reexamine

many levies with a view of making adjustments. Rep. Wilbur D. Mills (D-Ark.), has written his view on tax changes for Prentice-Hall. He serves on the joint committee on internal revenue taxation, and is reputedly influential in shaping tax policy. Representative Mills suggests several areas in the tax field which he believes will be the subject of legislative consideration. "Any revision undertaken next year will, I think, follow the general pattern established for the excise tax revision measure and the loophole closing bill," he said. Among the areas in which he looks for changes are taxation of life insurance companies; taxation of farm and other type cooperatives; depletion allowance; problems of net operating losses; corporate distributions and adjustments; estate and gift taxes; and capital gains. Doesn't Like View Wall Street doesn't like his view on capital gains when he says: "Even a cursory review of the present capital gains basket reveals a large number of income items which involve neither a capital asset nor a sale or exchange." Congressman Earl Wilson (R-Ind.), plans to take a different tack on capital gains taxes. He's going to urge cutting them in half. In that way, he holds there'll be more desire to take profits in the stock market by many now restrained by the 25 per cent tax. Recently he said of the capital gains tax: "We are killing the golden-egg goose, drying up the springs from which flow men money into the Federal Treasury. How short-sighted can we be?" Levy on Capital He calls the present capital gains tax a levy on capital and not on income and holds that it sterilizes billions of risk capital, a substantial portion of which would otherwise find its way into investment in new and small business, thereby providing many new job opportunities. Representative Wilson estimates there exists today unrealized capital gains in excess of \$200 billion. He believes halving the tax would bring realizing and add sufficiently to government revenues to help pay off some of the national debt.

FBI Agents Barred By Georgia Judge

Colquitt, Ga. - (UPI) - A Georgia judge has ordered officials in Terrell county, scene of the first action under the 1957 Civil Rights act, to withhold voter records from federal agents even if it takes a special police force. Superior Court Judge Walter I. Geer, whose jurisdiction includes Terrell county in southwest Georgia, issued his order Friday to the board of registrars in the county. Marines, Ships Engage in Games

Camp Pendleton, Calif. - (UPI) - Marines of the 1st Marine Division and ships of the Pacific Fleet engaged in war games today off the coast. Thousands of battle-equipped leathernecks were to be brought ashore by 28-passenger helicopters in a "vertical envelopment" landing on the beach near this sprawling camp. The carrier U.S.S. Kearsarge carried the 'copters for the amphibious maneuver. A total of 38 ships from Pacific Fleet were assigned to the exercise. Four Royal Canadian warships also were with the task force, commanded by Rear Adm. H. S. Persons. Brig. Gen. A. K. Bower was in command of the 20,000 Marines.

point of a bayonet," Judge Geer said. "If they need protection they can get the protection they need to perform their duties according to the laws of the constitution of the state of Georgia." It was Geer's second head-on challenge to federal authority. Shortly after the Justice department charged the Terrell registrars with discrimination against would-be Negro voters on Thursday he said he would jail any FBI man who tried to investigate his own court "in any high-handed or menacing manner." In his order, Geer told the registrars to surrender no further records to federal men unless his court ordered them to do so. He also directed that they bar federal agents from preparing or assisting in the preparation of any voter list. Furthermore, "for the purpose of carrying out his order the sheriff of Terrell county, Ga., is authorized and directed to employ as many deputies as in his discretion will be necessary to enforce this order and to protect you to the extent that you may perform your duties as registrars.
