

Lost Creek Dam Would Be of Earth, Gravel Fill; To Be 240 Feet High

All information so far is preliminary, Ingraham stressed.

A dam at the Lost creek site would be just below the mouth of Lost creek, of earth and gravel fill, 240 feet high, would hold 240,000 acre feet of total storage, have a minimum of 74,000 acre feet. Active storage would be 164,000 acre feet. It would have a power possibility of 25,000 kilowatts and power would be drawn on a base-load plan (same amount used continually). No re-regulation dam would be located downstream. Power, irrigation and flood control would be the purposes of the dams. Minimum pool would cover 1,140 acres.

The Elk creek dam would be located three miles above the mouth of Elk creek and just below where the west fork comes in. It would be an earth and rockfill dam. The

dam would be 160 feet high. Minimum pool would be 2,000 acre feet. Total storage would be 62,000 acre feet and active storage 60,000 acre feet. No power development is contemplated, Ingraham said. Purposes would be irrigation and flood control.

Would Be Alternates

These dams would be alternates to the Lewis creek site, the engineer said. They would provide the same amount of storage. Draw-down would be in summer and fall to make flood control space available, Ingraham said. Period of maximum flood danger is usually from mid-November to the end of February, he added. The reservoir would be gradually filled starting in February. Filling operations would continue to the first part of May.

Preliminary estimates show the two dams would cost slightly less than the Lewis

creek dam considered, Ingraham said. This includes all costs. Construction of the Lewis creek dam would require the purchase of more land which would be flooded and more relocation than Lost creek dam construction would mean.

A diversion dam 30 to 35 feet high would be required for both Lost creek and Lewis creek dams. This would be located one mile down from the mouth of Trail creek, Ingraham explained.

Dam 226 Feet High

A possible dam at the Copper site on the Applegate river would be 226 feet high, have a total holding capacity of 72,000 acre feet and 55,000 acre feet of active storage, Ingraham said.

Maintaining a minimum pool for recreation purposes at one of the sites would require establishing a system for predicting flood control and irrigation needs, Ingraham said.

Spring run salmon would not be hampered by a diversion dam 30 to 35 feet high, Hatch said. Fall run salmon which are ready to spawn when they reach the dam probably would be unable to get over a dam that high, Hatch admitted. Fall run salmon all spawn below Gold Ray dam.

Money would be set aside for artificial rearing beds, Hatch explained. A dam at Lewis creek would mean a large hatchery there while Lost creek would not require such a large spawning area. Col. Paul H. Weiland, of the Jackson county chapter of the Izaak Walton league, had asked if diversionary dams over eight feet high would not hamper the migration of fish up river as a fish biologist had stated.

Negro Students Seek Entry To Louisiana State College

Eighty Negro undergraduates were expected to begin registration today at all-white Louisiana State college in New Orleans under terms of a federal judge's preliminary injunction.

The state attorney general's office, in a race against time, was preparing writs for presentation to the U.S. Fifth Circuit Court of Appeals in an attempt to have the order suspended.

Atty. Gen. Jack Gremlion said he hoped to have the writs ready before the day was over. But A. P. Tureaud, attorney for the Negroes, said he advised his clients to make application immediately.

If upheld in higher courts, Federal District Judge Herbert Christenberry's order would make the first break in school segregation at the undergraduate level in the state. Negroes have been enrolled in the graduate school at the main Louisiana State campus at Baton Rouge for several years.

Defends Refusal

Bridge Cables of Piano Wire Seen

New York —UPI— Bridge cables made of piano wire, steel tanks as light as a feather and thin as paper, girders no heavier than a match stick.

These are the potential results of research into the atomic structure of steel now being conducted in university and industry laboratories, according to Steelways, official publication of the American Iron and Steel Institute.

Once scientists know enough about the exact behavior of the atoms and molecules that make up steel, Steelways said, they will be able to "build" a steel capable of performing whatever particular functions are desired.

Skipper Declines Navy's Invitation

New York —UPI— Charles F. Romano, chief pilot for a New York towing firm, recently was in charge of maneuvering the Navy's 62,000-ton aircraft carrier Franklin D. Roosevelt from Brooklyn to Bayonne, N.J.

The five-mile trip was through the most heavily travelled waterway in the world. It required passing exactly under the middle of two bridges and skirting a wreck near one of them.

Nevertheless, Romano, with a dozen tugboats under his command, brought the carrier into berth in less than half an hour against a rapidly rising tide and strong onshore winds.

Navy officers were so impressed with his work that they invited him to take the Franklin D. Roosevelt out to sea some time.

But Romano declined with thanks, explaining, "I would only get seasick."

Tunisia Formally Joins Arab League

Tunis —UPI—Tunisia formally decided Monday night to join the Arab League.

A Tunisian cabinet meeting under President Habib Bourguiba, took the decision. Tunisia thus lined up with its North African neighbor, Morocco, which has already announced it will join the eight-nation league.

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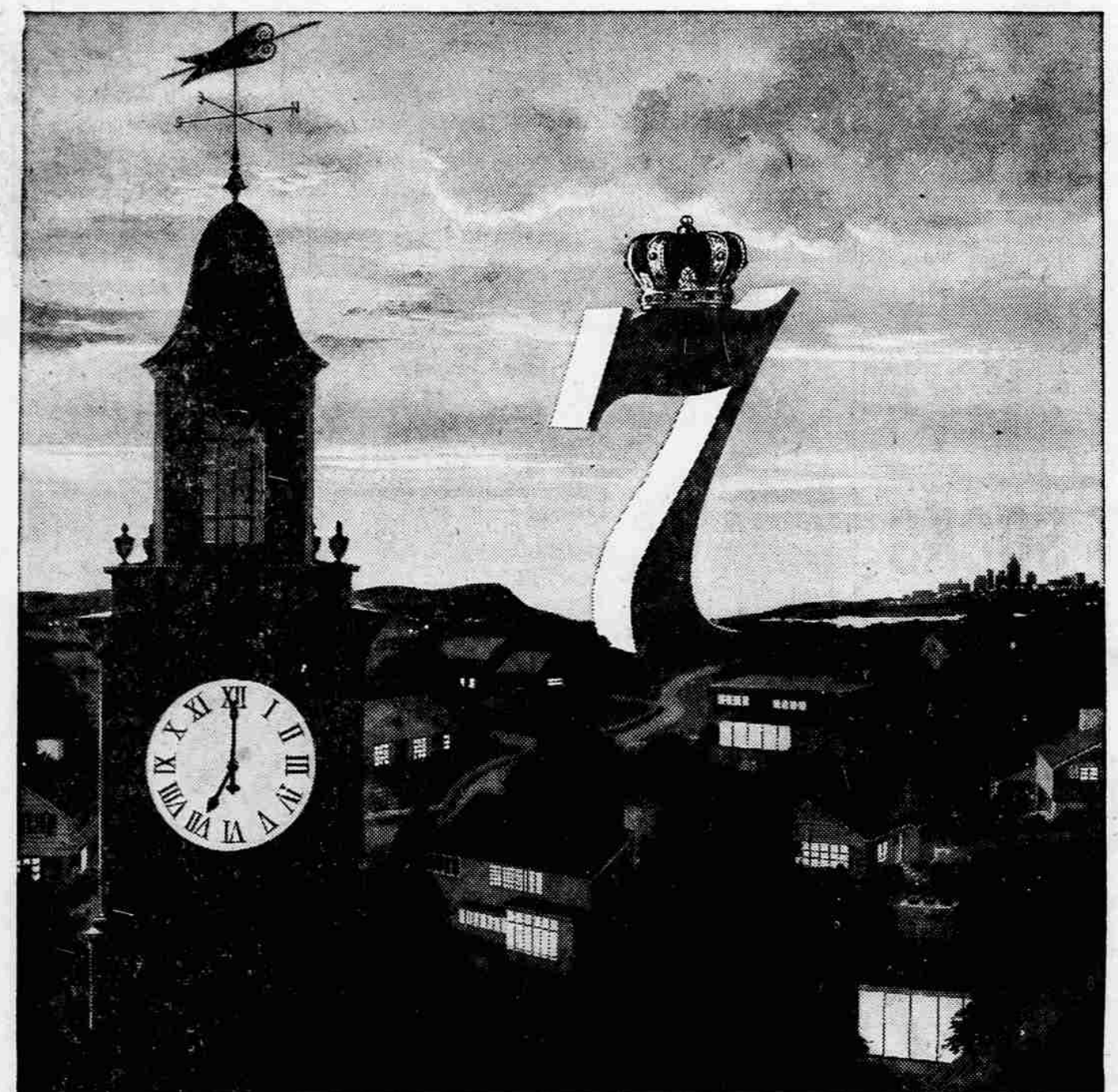
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Timing Important In Disagreements

Washington —UPI— "Doesn't your boss like 'yes men'?" Then learn to disagree with him wisely.

So advises the Bureau of Business Practice, which says timing is the important element in the technique of disagreeing.

Its advice is don't disagree with the boss when he is feeling depressed, irascible or ill, and find your chance when the two of you are alone.

Observe good manners in expressing your reaction to his ideas, and avoid such words as "idiotic," "ridiculous," or "nonsense." Under such a direct attack, a person withdraws from free communication. Instead, use such neutral phrases as "It might be worth considering..." "Perhaps you haven't thought of..." etc.

When you do make the boss change his mind, don't belittle him by asking him for a statement that he has reversed himself.

Discuss first what points you agree on, so he might feel more comfortable about capitulating.

And most important of all — don't disagree with the boss at all if the difference of opinion is of little importance.

Vancouver District Restrictions Lifted
