

Potato Crop for 1958 Estimated

Washington (UPI)—The Agriculture Department Wednesday estimated the 1958 potato crop at 259,046,000 hundredweight and predicted that the fall crop would total 176,575,000 hundredweight.

The Maine crop was estimated at 41,040,000 hundredweight.

Production in other leading fall states, by hundredweight included:

Idaho 39,770,000; Washington 4,180,000; Oregon 6,210,000; California 4,620,000.

Canada To Allow Turkey Imports For Use in Soup

Salem — Canada has relaxed its ban on turkeys from the United States to the extent of permitting imports by soup canning industries on an individual request basis. This advice was received by the state department of agriculture from the foreign agriculture service of the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Gustave Burmeister, FAS assistant administrator, said his agency recognizes this as a forward step, but agrees that it does not provide the relief that should be granted.

This advice followed a protest by the Oregon department of agriculture through the FAS upon Canada's recent removal of its ban on imports of chicken and fowl except turkeys, according to Market Development Chief Paul T. Rowell.

Sees Significance

Burmeister's report said the FAS fully recognizes the significance of the Canadian market to Oregon turkey growers and that Canada's ban on turkey imports from the United States was on the agenda for discussion during President Eisenhower's recent visit here.

Burmeister said the FAS plans to send another request to Canada stressing that prompt attention to removal of the restriction is needed if U.S. turkey growers are to sell their usual quantity in Canada during the coming holiday period.

Rowell said the state department of agriculture has called the FAS' attention to the need for quick action if any shipments are to be made for Canada's Thanksgiving period which comes there in mid-October. Prior to Canada's embargo the past year, he said, around 15 per cent of Oregon's turkey production was marketed in Canada.
