

Sunday Will Be First Day of GOP Finance Drive

Sunday, Sept. 14, will be the first day of the "Neighbor to Neighbor" finance drive for Republicans in Oregon, according to Don Stathos, chairman of Jackson County Republican Central committee.

The campaign, based on door-to-door solicitation, is a new method of political fund raising and is being tried this election year as a means to give each voter an opportunity to "Buy a Share in Your Political Party," Stathos said.

The idea has been adopted for vigorous promotion by the American Heritage Foundation and the American Advertising Council with the cooperation of both major political parties.

No Special Groups

Local Republican leaders have stated that their party has no desire to be supported and controlled by special interest groups. They believe that by getting the support of many citizens representing the general interest, the Republican party can best serve the country.

"Americans have built for themselves a political system that is the most expensive in the world," Stathos said, "and since the money has to be raised somewhere, this drive affords an opportunity for each registered Republican to perform a valuable political duty."

Mrs. Al Littrell, local chairman of the "Neighbor to Neighbor" campaign, has asked that residents be prepared when his Republican neighbor calls. Each Republican is urged to "back your ballot with your buck," she said.

Farming Costs Push Age Bracket Upward in State

Corvallis—High cost of operating a modern farm is pushing the age brackets upward for Oregon farmers.

Oregon now has the smallest proportion of farm operators under 35 years of age and the largest percentage over 65 years of any census year dating back to 1920, says D. Curtis Mumford, Oregon State college agricultural economist.

The report, based on the 1954 federal census of agriculture, shows that while the average age of Oregon farmers has changed little in the past two decades, there are fewer "young" farmers.

That times have changed since an ambitious young man with a plow and good team of horses could break into farming is emphasized by the fact that only one per cent of all Oregon farmers were under 25 of age in 1954.

At the other end of the age scale, 17 per cent of Oregon's farmers were 65 years or older at the last census.

Average age of farm operators in Oregon is 50.4 years. While slightly higher than the 49.7 age for 1950, it is similar to the 1945 and 1940 figures of 50.1 and 50.6 years, respectively.

Little or no change in the state average—coupled with a decline in percentage of young farmers—has resulted in a marked "bunching up" around the 50-year average. Twenty-five per cent of all Oregon farmers are in the age group of 45 to 54 years, and 88 per cent are at least 35 years old.

Jefferson county rates the distinction of having Oregon's youngest farm operators—average age, 45.3. Multnomah has the oldest—52.4 years.

Youngest average ages are in eastern Oregon. Of the state's 15 counties having farm operators averaging less than 50 years of age, only two were among western Oregon's 10 counties: Tillamook with 47.9 years and Linn with 49.2.

Only four of eastern Oregon's 17 counties average 50 years or more. Baker, Harney, Umatilla, and Union were a fraction above the 50-year mark.

Charles E. Webb, 22, driver of one car, and his father, Charles T. Webb, both of Pullman, Wash., were killed. Mrs. Rondal Rich, a passenger in the White car, died the following day.

Date for sentencing was not set.
