Why Do So Many Persons Drown?

A while ago I was reading that each year in this country some 6,500 persons lose their lives by drowning.

What is sad is that in so many cases the person was doing what he had been warned not to do. He may have gone swimming at a beach where there was a dangerous undertow, or he may have gone swimming where it was illegal to go because at that point there was no lifeguard. In many a case he swam too far out, or he went swimming far alone, or he went far out into a cold lake at night.

Six boys drown to one girl, probably because boys are more venturesome. The greatest risk comes between the ages of 15 and 19, when boys

are most reckless of danger.

At earlier ages, as under the age of 10, what often happens is that the child, while wading, suddenly steps off a shelf into deep water, and drown before anyone notes his distress.

Small children manage to drown around the house, having fallen into a swimming pool, a garden pool, a cess-pool, a well or a cistern. An occasional child drowns in a few inches of water in the bathtub, while his mother runs to answer the telephone.

Many drownings occur, of course, when boats overturn; and here again, deaths are often due to the refusal of people to accept warnings or advice.

Youngsters will take a leaky boat out, or they will go out when storm-warnings are flying, or so many will get into a boat that they swamp it, or while two persons are trying to change places in a boat, they will tip it over. Obviously, the wise parent will see to it that his children early learn to swim.

Mexico Depots Two Americans

Mexico City—UPI—At least two Americans have been deported and two others jailed on charges of complicity in last week's Communist-supported student riots, reliable sources said Thursday.

Earlier reports that 10 Americans have been shipped out of the country and that 40 to 50 more would be expelled today could not be confirmed immediately. The sources indicated, however, that other U. S. citizens may be penalized in connection with last week's disorders.

They said Allan Lewis, a literature professor at Mexico's National University, and Bernard Balsenheim, general manager of the Mexican-American Construction company, were flown out of the country Tuesday night.

Hal Roach Buys Mutual System

Hollywood—UPI—Purchase of the Mutual Broadcasting System by the Hal Roach Studios for more than \$2 million in cash and stock has been announced by Hal Roach Jr.

Roach said acquisition of the huge radio network was an "important step" in his company's plan to move into many phases of the entertainment industry with a widely diversified program.

Hal Roach Studios is a subsidiary of the Scranton Corp. of Scranton, Pa., which acquired the Hollywood company last May.

War II Bomber Crew in Reunion

Hollywood—UPI—Crewmen of a B24 bomber shot down in the Philippines during World War II were reunited Wednesday night on a television program, "It Could Be You."

The 11 airmen saw each other for the first time in 13 years when called on stage to greet Lt. John Lampe, South Pasadena, Calif., pilot of the bomber, guided "I'll Get By."

Guerillas called the men out of the jungle one by one after they had parachuted a half mile from a Japanese prison camp.

Bob Gorman, Landsdowne, Pa.; Floyd Swain, Soldier, Kans.; Paul Cantu Jr., McAllen, Tex.; Larry Murphy, Cleveland; Foster Derr, Miami; and Ermidio Fortunato, Lancaster, Ohio.
