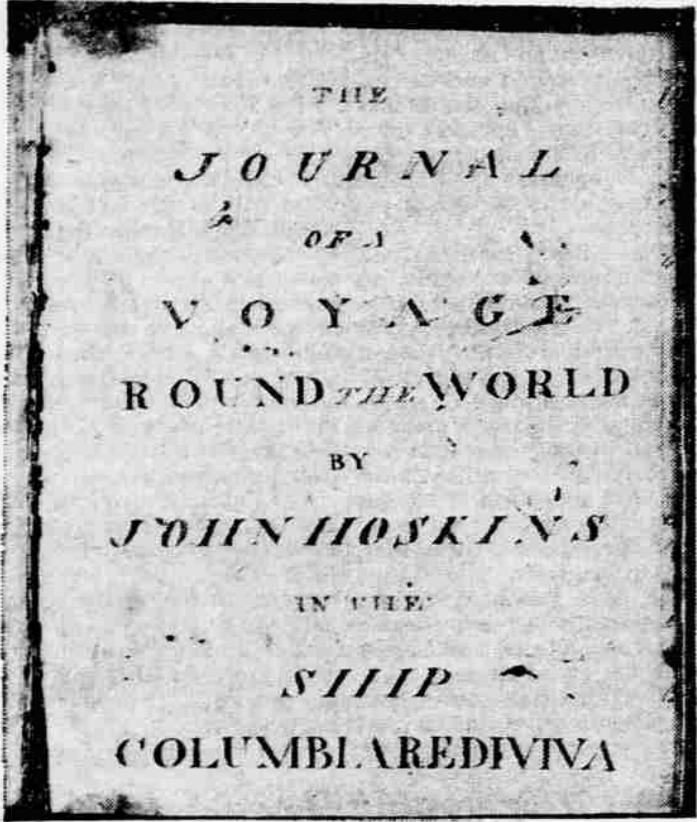
Baton Rouge, La.—Sen. Allen Ellender (D-La.) on East-West tensions such as the crisis in the Formosa Strait: "It is my belief that if these brush fire wars continue we should go to the core of the trouble—Russia—while we have the power left."

Chicago—Dr. Andrew C. Ivy, champion of the controversial "cancer drug" krebiozen, on why he administered the drug to himself to treat a pre-cancerous condition in his tongue: "I always believe in taking my own medicine."

Washington—FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover, in denying he ever said American youth was going to the dogs: "I have never stated that I felt the younger generation as a whole is going to the dogs. . . **HISTORICAL SHIP'S LOG**—A unique sailing diary directly associated with the discovery of the Columbia river has been given to the Oregon Historical society, according to Director Thomas Vaughan. The ship's log was kept in 1792 by John Box Hoskins, supercargo aboard the ship Columbia Rediviva. It was on this voyage of the Columbia that Capt. Robert Gray discovered and sailed into the Columbia river. The discovery of this river laid the foundations of the United States claim to the Oregon country, Vaughan said. The diary will be on view in the new traveling museum, The Centennial Van of History, which will travel the state this month, Vaughan said.

**Fifth Generating Unit in Dalles Dam**





























