Welfare Grant Revisions Approved

Portland — (UPI) — Welfare grant revisions, the first increase in two years, were approved Tuesday by the State Public Welfare Commission.

The revisions mean an increase of about \$2.50 in each case in several welfare categories plus an increase in medical care allowances.

The Commission said the increase should be reflected in checks in November, in the following programs: Aid to the permanently and totally disabled, old age assistance, aid to the blind and aid to dependent children.

Cougar, Wash.—(UPI)—Charles R. McGhee, Portland, was recovering from mild shock and a deep chill in a Vancouver hospital today after a seven-hour ordeal of clinging to a rock in waist-deep water deep inside a 2,900-foot diversion tunnel.

McGhee was saved after he threw himself into the 42-degree water as darkness approached and was carried into the hands of a rescue crew at the mouth of the tunnel.

McGhee, Frank Moser of Beaverton and William Earl Snodderly, 31, Portland, were thrown into the swift water when a 1 1/2-inch cable which was supporting the steel beam they were riding slipped loose from a winch. The mishap occurred about 11:40 a.m.

Moser managed to grab a line and was pulled to safety by his fellow workers.

Snodderly drowned. His body was carried through the long tunnel and was recovered about half a mile downstream about 5 p.m.

McGhee was carried about 1,000 feet into the tunnel where he managed to grab a rock and pull himself partly out of the stream. He watched helplessly for hours as rescue attempts failed and two Air Force men almost lost their lives in trying to save him.

NG Sunday Drills Provide Effective, Realistic Training

Sunday drill periods for National Guard units in Oregon are designated to provide more effective training, and a more realistic approach to training in the atomic age, high Guard officers reported today.

Maj. Gen. Thomas A. Rilea, Oregon's adjutant general, speaking through an aide, stated that it has long been recognized throughout the United States that two-hour drill periods are not sufficient to provide adequate training, and that more and more the trend, nationally, is toward "multiple drill" periods—that is, periods in excess of two hours in multiples of two.

Two hours simply is not long enough for preparation and conclusion, with an adequate training period in between, he indicated.

About 10 Per Cent

But, he added, at present there will be no more than 9 or 10 Sunday drills in any fiscal year. In addition, the usual two extra week end drill periods held prior to the annual two-week training camp in the summer will no longer be necessary.

While multiple drills, usually on week ends, are being held throughout the country, it is a state policy to try them in units of the 41st division, General Rilea said. However, he indicated, the National Guard bureau has strongly recommended some such type of training to supplement the two-hour drill periods.

The new training set-up is part of the Guard's transition to the "Pentomic" concept of organization, with larger units supported by armor, and organized into battle groups rather than regiments. In such an organization, General Rilea stated each soldier must be better trained, and able to take an effective, coordinated place in the fast-moving organization. He said it is simply facing up to the realities of modern military needs.

Among Top 10

General Rilea pointed out that the Oregon National Guard is rated as among the top 10 Guard organizations in the nation, and the best in the entire Sixth Army area, on the basis of a number of different qualifications. Washington state second, he said.

Attempts during the afternoon to get a raft to McGhee were not successful. One came within three or four feet of him, but he was not able to grab it. The bottom of the raft was ripped open as it was pulled over the ledge on the way out. A plywood boat was sent down the tunnel but it came out dashed to splinters.

Lt. Arthur Bennett, 29, and S-Sgt. Richard Grigsby, 29, the latter a silver star award winner in Korea, were lowered into the tunnel at 5:20 p.m. in a six-man rubber raft.

The raft was swamped and upended. Lt. Bennett floated out the exit seven minutes later and Sgt. Grigsby grabbed a rope rigging in the raft. He managed to ride the raft through the tunnel and tried to grab McGhee, but failed.

Sgt. Grigsby then lost his grip on the raft and was carried out of the tunnel by the current.

Oregon Governor Candidates Swap Efficiency Claims

Salem — (UPI) — Oregon's two gubernatorial candidates Tuesday engaged in an exchange over office efficiency, one charging sub-standard audits and the other charging reckless spending.

Gov. Robert Holmes, the Democratic incumbent, accused Republican Secretary of State Mark Hatfield of being dangerously far behind in audits of state agencies. He declared that out of 70 agency audits Hatfield had submitted, "56 required from six months to an extreme of 19 months to complete."

The Governor continued, "I am advised that in private enterprise such audits would be completed in some three months."

Hatfield countered that the Governor's statements were "just another example of the Governor's irresponsible disregard or ignorance of the facts."

He asserted that his auditing department was now virtually caught up with its work for the first time since during World War II. He added, "When I took office the division was some 25 audits behind, as compared with three minor ones at present."

Hatfield went on to charge that "reckless spending policies" in the executive department would force Holmes or his successor to go to the Legislature for a budget supplement.

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Profit Taking Snags Stock List Advance
