

Teamsters To Seek Ouster of Monitor, Hoffa Declares at Committee Hearing

Washington — (UPI) — Teamster President James R. Hoffa revealed to the Senate Rackets Committee today that the union will try to oust New York attorney Godfrey Schmidt as a member of the court-appointed teamster board of monitors.

Hoffa said the teamsters will seek a court order barring Schmidt from the board on grounds of a "conflict of interest." The attorney represented a New York rank and file group that sought to block Hoffa's election to the presidency.

Hoffa disclosed the plan

when asked if he hired a private agency to investigate Schmidt's background.

"I didn't and I don't know of anybody who did," Hoffa said, adding that Schmidt was so well known he didn't see any need of such an investigation.

Board Petitions Court

The three-man board of monitors was appointed by a federal judge to keep tabs on teamster activities after the rank and file group charged that Hoffa's election was "rigged."

The board petitioned the

court Wednesday to clarify its powers and to head off Hoffa's plan to hold a new convention in February—a step that would lead to termination of the

board. The committee, clearing up odds and ends as it neared completion of Hoffa's marathon testimony, asked the teamster president about a credit check the union made on members of the jury which acquitted Hoffa of bribery charges last year.

Hoffa replied that it was part of a check run on prospective jurors. He said a labor leader facing trial was entitled to know whether prospective jurors were anti-labor and might hold other prejudicial views.

Hoffa also was asked if he threatened the life of Sol Lipman, general counsel of the Retail Clerks Union. Hoffa

denied it, but committee counsel Robert F. Kennedy said the group has "information directly to the contrary."

Hoffa acknowledged having words with Lipman over trusteeship of a Detroit clerks local. But he denied saying he could have Lipman killed and nobody would know about it.

Two of the three monitors asked Federal Judge F. Dickinson Letts to block the proposed election in February on the ground a democratic vote could not be assured until reforms are made in the giant

union. Letts plans to hold hearings on the petition in about a week and will rule later.

Hoffa made it plain the purpose of the election would be to get rid of his court-appointed "watchdogs."

Objection Filed

Filing the petition were Martin E. O'Donoghue, chairman of the monitor board, and Godfrey Schmidt, L. D. Wells Jr., monitor representing Hoffa's leadership, filed an objection to the petition.

Kennedy said the Senate committee might wind up its

seven-week investigation of Hoffa's affairs today and recess for two months.

Kennedy said the committee would review further with Hoffa the bankrupt Team-

sters-sponsored Sun Valley development in Florida plus "several new things."

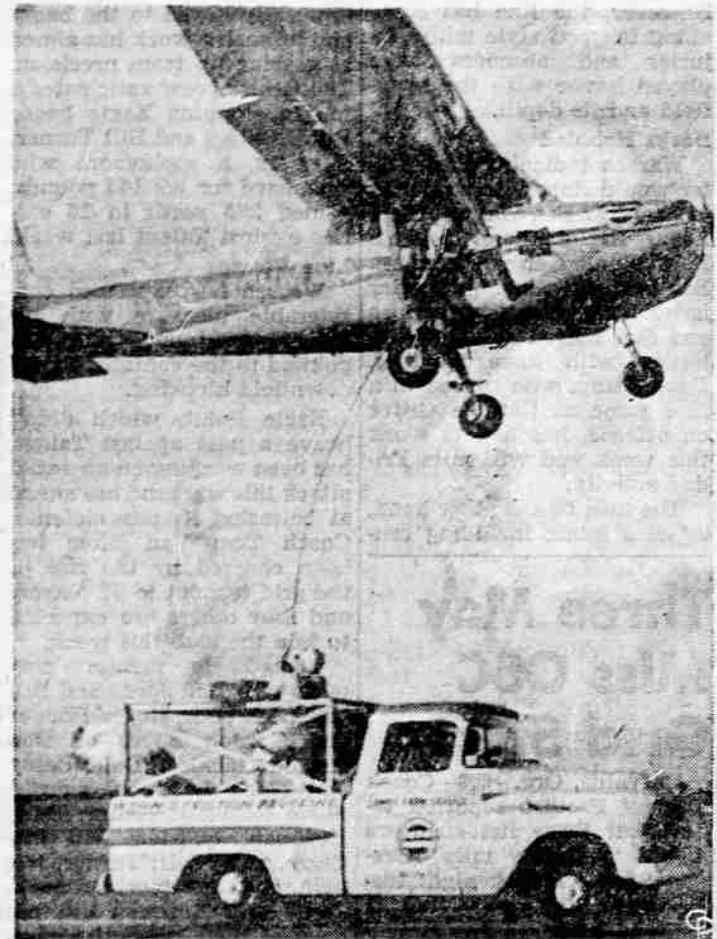

Pill To Prevent Pregnancy Said 100 Per Cent Effective

San Francisco — (UPI) — A world famous gynecologist says a pill for preventing pregnancy has proved "100 per cent effective" in two years of testing. Dr. John Rock, clinical professor emeritus of gynecology at Harvard University Medical school, made this statement Wednesday at a press conference called by the Planned Parenthood association of San Francisco, Inc.

"In experiments conducted under the auspices of the Planned Parenthood federation in Puerto Rico, and also in Los Angeles, results have been decisive," he said.

Sells for 50 Cents

The compound is produced commercially by two pharmaceutical houses, Parke-Davis and Searle. The pills now sell for 50 cents. It must be obtained on prescription.

The drug is a synthetic compound chemically related to sex hormones. It halts production of eggs in the female ovary. When a woman stops taking her daily pill, egg production resumes.

Rock said 14 per cent of the 285 women in Puerto Rico

who took the pill "experienced some side effects."

They had nausea or breast symptoms, but after the third month these vanished," he said. "And in many instances they were controllable by the use of other medication."

"There were no lasting side effects on the breast, on fertility or anything else."

"The drug was 100 per cent effective in preventing conception. When the women stopped using it, there was no difficulty experienced in becoming pregnant."

Rock, a Roman Catholic, said his church has no objection to the use of the drug for regularizing a woman's periods.

"The church does object to its use as a contraceptive," he added.

The use of the pill was reported earlier this summer at the convention of the American Medical association here. Dr. Edgar Wayburn, editor of the San Francisco Society Medical Bulletin, said the drug is still in the "experimental stage."

"It is not yet in general use," he said.
