

Cardinals Tip Braves 5-3 In Hack's Debut as Pilot

Smilin' Stan Hack is only minding the store for the St. Louis Cardinals but he aims to show a profit just the same.

Announced as the interim manager when Fred Hutchinson was fired Wednesday, Hack made a successful debut Wednesday night in a 5-3 victory over the Milwaukee Braves. Hack's objective is

to make up a 2½-game deficit and beat out the Cincinnati Reds for fourth place. The loss cut the Braves' first-place margin over idle Pittsburgh to 5½ games but their magic clinching number is still only three. The Braves can cut it to two when they play the Cardinals again tonight and then could clinch on Friday night.

Ernie Banks hit his 47th homer to lead the Chicago Cubs to a seven-inning, 6-2 victory over the Philadelphia Phillies in the only other National league game. The Detroit Tigers beat the New York Yankees, 5-2, and the Boston Red Sox topped the Kansas City Athletics, 4-2, after a 6-3 defeat in the only American league victory.

Rookie Gene Green knocked in two runs with a homer and a triple as the Cardinals kayoed 20-game winner Warren Spahn in six innings and handed the Milwaukee southpaw ace his 11th setback.

Banks, Mantle Homer

Banks hit a two-run homer high over the left field roof at Connie Mack stadium, Philadelphia, and rookie right-hander limited the Phillies to five hits in the rain-shortened game.

Mickey Mantle hit his 41st homer, a blast that cleared the right field roof at Detroit and was estimated at 500 feet, but Jim Bunning held the Yankees to only six other singles for his 13 triumph.

Reno Bartoia knocked in three runs with two homers as the Tigers dealt 21-game winner Bob Turley his seventh loss and took the season series, 12-10.

Bill Renna, subbing for Ted Williams, hit a two-run homer and Don Buddin and Frank Malzone also homered for the Red Sox, who broke an eight-game losing streak in the nightcap. The Athletics won the opener on a grand slam homer by catcher Harry Chitt.

Steelers Concentrating On New Running Attack

(This is the seventh of 12 dispatches on the 1958 prospects of National Football League teams.)

Pittsburgh—UPI—Coach Buddy Parker hopes an "SOS" cry which welled through Forbes field for many seasons won't echo at Pitt stadium, where the Pittsburgh Steelers will play their home games in 1958.

The distress chant—"Same Old Steelers"—rang out at the Pittsburgh Pirate ballpark when paying customers sounded their disappointment at the Steelers.

Parker, who turned in a 6-6 record last season in his first year as Steeler headmaster, has concentrated on a brand new running attack. But he falls back on a standard opening line when interviewed about his team's prospects.

"If my quarterbacks can come through..." is Buddy's invariable reply to sports writers.

Tank Younger at fullback may spark a revival of the Steeler offense which was the poorest in the National League last season. For nine seasons Younger was a key man in the Los Angeles Rams attack.

Larry Krutko, rookie from West Virginia University, is being groomed as Younger's understudy.

The Speedsters

"Halfbacks Billy Wells, George Volkert, Ed Sears and Faye Mitchell along with veteran Ray Mathews may charge up our running attack this season," Parker said cautiously.

Mitchell, a stocky, 198-pounder who scored 36 touchdowns in his three-year career at Tennessee A & I, is an explosive runner who may develop into the key man in Parker's plans. This week, Parker obtained Billy Reynolds, a good ball carrier and punt return specialist, from the Cleveland Browns.

Quarterback Earl Morrall, acquired from the San Francisco Forty Niners last year in a trade, is an accurate passer who shows promise but lacks the maturity that stamps a pro star. Len Dawson, Purdue alumnus, has been pressing Morrall for the starting assignment.

Jack Kemp is a signal caller who has developed into a top-flight punter and is giving veteran Jug Girard competition for the kicking chores.

If Tom Miner can sustain the field goal accuracy he has shown in exhibition games, Steeler President Art Rooney can sleep without interruption. When the Steelers were in dire need of a field goal expert two years ago, Rooney was besieged with suggestions. One fan phoned him at 3 a.m. and promised to send a kicker.

Main Concern

Parker's principal concern is a defense end or defensive tackle. All-pro tackle Ernie Stautner can play defensive end if need be but his usual spot will need a capable replacement.

The center spot has been another problem for the Steelers. Regular Ed Beatty, attending classes at the University of Tennessee dental school, reports only on week ends until the term ends later this month.

Beatty's failure to learn the plays and keep up with the team was "killing our offense," according to Parker.

Always respected for their defensive line, the Steelers have a no less fearsome array this season. Linebackers Ralph Felton and John Reger, ends George Tarasovic and Stautner along with tackle Dave Liddick and Joe Krupa and middle guard Dale DeDrill ease Parker's worries.

Parker, who moulded championship teams at Detroit, believes an intangible is just

as important as defensive strength and a running attack.

"You always need a little luck to win a championship," he said.
