

Faubus Sees Fight In Courts Solution

Little Rock, Ark.—Gov. Orval E. Faubus said Thursday that the only way to keep the Little Rock school crisis from turning into racial conflict is to fight it out in the courts.

Faubus refused to say whether the formation of a private corporation to reopen Little Rock's closed high schools as private, segregated institutions, is his idea.

The Little Rock Private School Corporation held its first meeting to elect officers and decide whether to try to lease the closed schools before or after a special integration election Sept. 27. The meeting was closed.

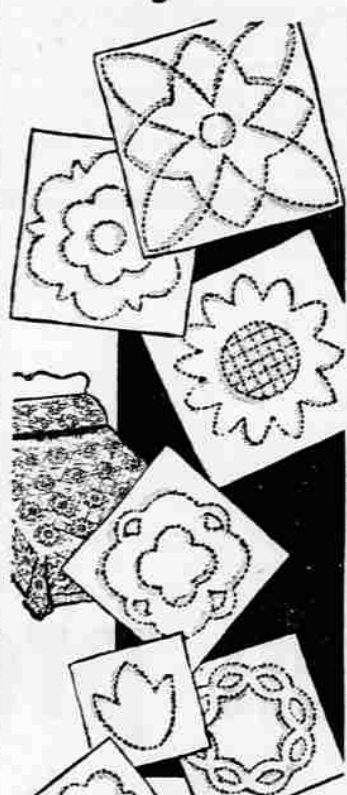

Alice T. — He wants me to bar my parents.

John T. — They have no right to meddle.

Alice T. — My husband and I defied our parents to get married three years ago, but a great deal of strain and unhappiness has come into our lives. For one thing, my parents soon relented and attempted to help up, but John's parents are still bitterly opposed to our marriage and refuse to visit us.

More strain has resulted from the fact that we have not had a child. John assures me that it makes no difference to him, but he shows signs of resenting me and slighting me in the presence of other women.

Two months ago, at the urging of my parents who agreed to foot the bill, I started going to a psychiatrist. My husband found out about it the other day and hit the ceiling. He threatens to leave me flat if I do not stop visiting this man and he wants me to bar my parents from our home.

I love John very much, but I am wondering whether our marriage will still be worth anything if I agree not only to stop going to my doctor, but to bar my parents.

John T. — I feel that Alice's parents are at the bottom of our troubles. They did not forgive our marriage for the purpose of accepting me. On the contrary — they just want to keep in touch with Alice in order to break us up, and they seem to be succeeding.

What right do they have to coax my wife into going to an expensive troublemaker, just because they are willing and able to pay his fees?

If some outsider is to start passing judgment on me and running my family, at least I should have something to say about choosing him. I knew nothing about this until it slipped out by chance in conversation a week ago, and I resent it very much.

It is not true that I have been nasty to my wife because she has not had a child, but I do think it would make much more sense if she went to a medical doctor about this problem, instead of wasting her time with a head-shrinker.

Injuries To The Eye

I recently read an interesting article by Dr. Albert N. Lemoine Jr., of Kansas City, on emergency treatment of injuries of the eye. One of the most dangerous things that can happen to an eye is to have a bit of iron or steel fly into it. Such a foreign body must immediately be removed. If it should be left in, and the eye should be lost, the other eye could degenerate too. Sometimes when a foreign body goes into the back chamber of the eye and causes bleeding, the vision cannot be saved.

Certainly, when a person has any severe injury, he should go immediately to the best ophthalmologist he can find. When vision is so tremendously important to a man, one wonders how some persons will walk around for days with one or both eyes

being destroyed by an inflammation.

If I were to suffer even a severe blow to one eye, I would immediately go to an ophthalmologist. Certainly, I would go in a hurry if I ever had any loss of vision, or a pain in an eye. I would want to find out quickly what had gone wrong, and to learn if any cure could be worked.

In this column I must keep saying that anyone who works in a shop or chemical laboratory or any place in which something might explode or in which a tiny chip of metal might go flying through the air, should wear strong goggles. It is almost criminal not to take this simple precaution. Because he did not wear goggles in his basement shop, a physician friend of mine lost almost all of his sight.

Dr. Alvarez hopes his readers will understand that it would be impossible for him to answer requests for information or to attempt to diagnose by mail.
