California Woman Injured in Accident

Delores Snead, 22, of Fresno, Calif., was taken to Medford Osteopathic hospital Friday morning with leg injuries after the car in which she was riding was involved in an accident on Highway 99 in front of the Tucker Sno-Cat corporation, state police reported.

She was a passenger in a car operated by James Howard Morse, 40, of 261 Mead st., Ashland, which collided with one operated by Robert Randall Wilcox, 38, of 28 Geneva st., Medford, according to police.

Morse was northbound on Highway 99 and approached another vehicle stopped waiting for a car to make a left turn. Police said Morse was unable to stop in time, and swerved into the right lane in the path of the Wilcox vehicle. Police cited Morse for failure to operate on the right side of the highway.

SENTENCED AS U.S. SPY
