The New Living Polio Vaccine

A report has come from Dr. Chislain Courtois, Director of the Medical laboratory of the Belgian Congo, who says that they have been testing the new live vaccine for polio, and in four epidemics it promptly put a stop to the outbreak. This is good news.

A Possible Test for Cancer

In a recent report from the Sloan-Kettering Institute for Cancer Research, I learn that a substance has been isolated from cancer tissue—a substance that appears to be produced only in cancers. The discovery of this "Cytolipin H" suggests that some day we may have a test specific for cancer—a test that can be used to "screen" hundreds of thousands of persons who seem to be well. If we ever get a chemical test that will reveal cancer in an early symptomless stage, our ability to cure cancer will increase spectacularly. It has been shown in some cancer prevention clinics that if cancer is found in persons have no symptoms, the rate of cure is around 75 per cent, while if the growth is found only after the patient has suffered for months, and has lost much weight and strength, the chances of cure may drop to 20 per cent.

Pin Worms

Until a year ago hundreds of mothers were asking me what to do for their children with pin worms. They said the usual old treatment with gentian violet did not work well. I imagine that the let-up in that stream of doctors is due to the fact that doctors now are using much more effective drugs, containing diethazine. It is sold under brand names. It is very helpful.
