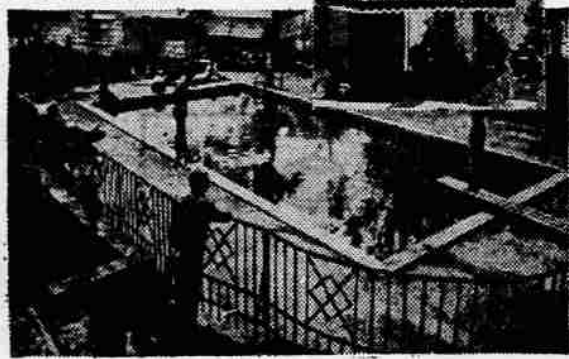

What Is The Law?

Federal Courts Cannot Admit Wire Tapping

Sam Brown is charged with violating a Federal statute. Evidence was obtained by Federal officers through the tapping of Brown's telephone wires; but is this evidence admissible in the Federal court? The Federal courts have held that the tapping of telephone wires is not an illegal search or seizure, therefore does not fall within the scope of the Fourth Amendment to the Federal Constitution.

Right of People

The Fourth Amendment provides: "The right of the people to be secure . . . against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized."

"Olmstead v. United States" decided in the U. S. Supreme Court in 1928 was the leading case holding that evidence obtained by federal officers through the tapping of telephone wires was admissible in a Federal court.

In 1934, however, Congress enacted Section 605 of the Federal Communications Act which says in part: "No person not being authorized by the sender shall intercept any communication and divulge or publish the existence, contents, substance, purport, effect or meaning of such intercepted communication to any person."

Not Admissible

Under this statute evidence obtained through wire tapping of a telephone by Federal officers is not admissible in a Federal court. The "wire-tap" evidence against Sam Brown cannot therefore be admitted. This statute does not apply to the states. Evidence obtained by state officers through wire tapping is, generally, admissible in a state court. However, many states, including Oregon, now have statutes prohibiting or restricting the use of wire tapping. A few of these states expressly forbid disclosure of the wire tapping evidence.
