The Seat of the Soul

Through the ages man has located his soul in a number of places in his body. Perhaps because Stone Age man noticed that emotion, and particularly fear sometimes caused rumbling in his abdomen and made his bowels move, he placed his soul in his intestines. This is why we say today that a courageous man has guts, or we read in the King James Version of the Bible, of "bowels of mercy," or that Joseph's "bowels yearned upon his brother."

In the more recent translations of the Bible, the word, "bowels" is changed to "heart." Today we say that a man is good-hearted or he has a kind heart, or a big heart, but of course, no scientific physician or physiologist now thinks of the heart as having anything to do with the soul. Today, we know that the mind, and presumably the soul, are located up in the brain.

The ancient Greeks had no clear idea of the functions of the brain, and for a long time had the curious idea that the mind is located in the midriff or the muscular diaphragm which divides the cavity of the chest from that of the abdomen. They noticed, perhaps, that under the influence of strong emotion, a person's breathing can become agitated. Hysterical women will sometimes for a few minutes, pant like a dog on a hot day. Since the old Greek word for the diaphragm was "phren" today we still use such words as frenzy, or phrenetic, frantic, phrenology, and schizophrenia.

When I was a boy in Hawaii, the Polynesians believed that a man's soul was in his bowels, and so it was a compliment to say that a man had an opu nui, or a big abdomen. This was like saying that he was big hearted.

Not Believed Now
A curious idea of the ancient Greeks was that a hysterical woman's "lump in the throat" or globus, which she can neither get up nor swallow down is due to a rising of her womb up into her neck. No one, of course, believes this today.

Interestingly, many of our words which describe temperament, such as phlegmatic, sanguine, melancholy, bilious or choleric, are based on the queer old idea of the four "humors"—phlegm, blood, black bile, and yellow bile. Although this idea had no basis in fact, it dominated medical and lay thought for some 3,000 years, and it still influences our speech. A bilious or choleric man was supposed to be full of yellow bile. Cholera used to mean both bile and anger.

A melancholic man was supposed to be full of black bile. We use an ancient idea when we say of someone, "He has his gall!" The ancients got the idea of black bile from the dark intestinal discharges produced by violent purging with a drug called hellebore. A sanguine man was supposed to be full of phlegm.

Ideas Survive
The old physicians made much of the supposed four qualities of matter—dryness, moistness, warmth and coldness, and these ideas survive today in our language. We speak of a warm or a cold temperament or we say, "cool as a cucumber." This is because cucumbers were once classified as cool to the third degree.

Curiously, the spleen was thought to have something to do with anger, and so we still speak of an angry man as full of spleen, or splenetic. The ancients thought the liver had much to do with our feelings of good or ill health, and hence, today, when we feel bad, we may say we are "a bit liverish," or bilious, or perhaps we go to a doctor and

suggest that he tone our liver up a bit. When I was a boy, this was supposed to be done with the help of repeated doses of calomel, or once a year, in the spring, people were given a big dose of calomel and molasses. Actually, today, we know that many persons with almost no liver left don't feel at all ill.

Another old idea was that our lives are controlled by so-called "vital spirits," or "animal spirits." We speak of high or low spirits, or we say that a discouraged man is dispirited. Today, we doctors don't know exactly what spirits are, and we no longer use the word.

Money Can Bring Great Unhappiness

The fact that much money can bring only unhappiness and bitterness was shown me years ago by a man of 55, whose very sad face I can still see in my mind's eye. He came to see me shortly after several clever business deals had netted him over a million dollars. When I asked him why he was the picture of dejection, he said that when wealth came to him, his wife promptly divorced him, and with the money he gave her she went to Europe. She took their daughter with her with the hope of marrying her to someone with a title. Their son departed to play polo in the Argentine, and there my unhappy patient was left, all alone with no one to care for him.

But I am sure that this man's experience with wealth would not dissuade many persons from accepting a million dollars if it came their way!
