

# Ohio State, Auburn Week End Favorites

New York—(UPI)—Ohio State and Auburn, the two schools which finished one-two in the nation last year, are solid favorites to win their opening football games Saturday.

The Buckeyes, the 1957 national collegiate football champions, were rated 13-

point picks over Southern Methodist at Columbus, Ohio, while Auburn was made a 10-point favorite over Tennessee for Saturday's nationally televised Southeastern Conference game at Birmingham, Ala.

Oklahoma, Michigan State and Notre Dame, three other schools expected to field powerful teams this year, also were made big favorites by the men who establish the nationally quoted point-spreads.

Football turnout has swelled to more than 80 with the opening of high school classes this week. Most of the newcomers are with the junior varsity.

The Tornado came through its David Douglas game intact and the coaches naturally are hoping that the crew will stay healthy.

After the Marshfield mix the Tornado bills Crater, here on Oct. 10, in the opener of its Southern Oregon conference campaign. It is hoped that end Lowell Dean will be ready for the Comet clash. He has been sidelined by surgery since shortly after practices began.

Coach Spiegelberg expects to get a look at the Marshfield club this Friday when it plays Sweet Home at Coos Bay.

Medford is idle this Friday because it was unable to line up a foe for the date.

# Hearty Wind For Yacht Cup Chase

Newport, R. I. — (UPI) — The champion sailboats of Britain and America swept off in a hearty breeze today for a real test of the faster yacht in the 107-year-old America's Cup races.

America's Columbia beautifully out-maneuvered Sceptre at the starting line and took a lead over the British cup sloop at the outset.

The race began at 9:30 a.m. (PDT). It had to be finished by 2:50 p.m. and today there appeared to be little danger the winner would not beat the deadline.

"Just give us a good stiff breeze and we will jolly well go," said Sceptre's professional skipper, Stanley Bishop.

**Lot In Remark**  
Yachtmen agreed there was a lot in what he said despite Sceptre's taking a bad beating from the American boat in the first race and trailing far behind in the second before it was called on account of slowness.

The overnight forecast was for winds up to 18 miles per hour by race time, which would be better than anything they have had before.

Today's race is a rerun of Monday's, which was declared no contest because it was not finished in the required five and one-half hours. The rule is intended to insure the sailboats do get enough breeze to make it more than a drifting match.

## Will Besmanoff Stops Miteff

Seattle, Wash. — (UPI) — Willi Besmanoff, jubilant over his first-round technical knockout victory over eighth-rated Alex Miteff, today challenged the entire heavyweight division, "especially Zora Folley."

"Bring on the Folley," the rugged German said. "I am ready for him and I know I can beat him."

Besmanoff, 201½, staggered Miteff, 206½, twice with left hooks in the first minute of the fight and then dropped him in a corner for a mandatory eight-count hanging over the upper strand after Besmanoff had landed a three-punch combination.

The bell rang seconds later and Miteff limped to his corner. The attending physician entered the ring and stopped the fight, saying the Argentine had suffered torn ligaments in his right knee. Miteff was cut under the right eye and was bleeding heavily from the nose and mouth.
