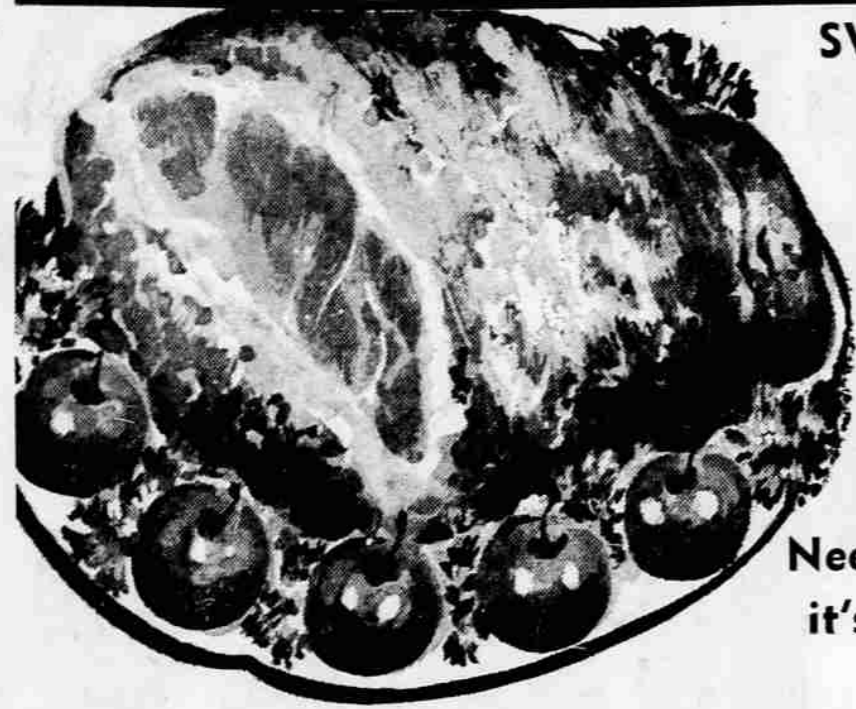

**SPICY APPLE TWIST**

Bake at 450 degrees for 25 to 30 minutes. Makes 16. Prepare... 2 large apples, pared, cored and sliced into wedges. Sift together 1 1/2 cups sifted Pillsbury's Best All Purpose Flour and 1 teaspoon salt into mixing bowl. Cut in 1/2 cup shortening until particles are the size of small peas. Sprinkle 4 to 5 tablespoons cold water over mixture while tossing and stirring lightly with fork. Add liquid to moisten particles, pushing lumps to side, until dough is just moist enough to hold together. Form into ball. Flatten to about 1/2 inch thickness, smooth edges. Roll out on floured surface to a 16 by 10 inch rectangle. Cut into 16, 10 by 1 inch strips. Wrap 1 strip around each apple wedge. Arrange in 13 by 9 by 2 inch pan, sides not touching. Brush with 1/2 cup melted butter. Sprinkle with mixture of 1/2 cup sugar and 1 teaspoon cinnamon. Pour 1/2 cup water over pastries. Bake in hot oven (450 degrees) 25 to 30 minutes until golden brown. Serve warm or cold, plain or with cream.

**Boy Scouts Receive Funds from Crusade**

(Editor's note: This is the first in a series of articles discussing the agencies for which funds are collected in the United Medford Crusade, now under way here.)

We read, only too frequently, of boys who get into trouble. It has been said they number but 2 per cent. But we do not often hear of those others who are trying to make something of their lives, those who might have been among the 2 per cent, except for character building organizations.

The Crater Lake Council, Boy Scouts of America, gives us cause to reflect on a volunteer organization that has made its mark on the lives of thousands of boys. The adult volunteer leaders in Scouting—and there are more than 1,400 of them in this area—realize that Scouting is something more than fun. They know it is a game with a purpose.

That purpose is to help boys become men by teaching them to play a team game for a citizenship role later and to inculcate in their daily lives a code of living influenced by the Scout Oath and Law.

When a boy joins a Scout unit at his church, school or other community institution he becomes a member of a team. It is here that he gets a lesson in democracy as he shares in team planning, elects leaders, and learns to live with his fellow team members as brother Scouts. In the program of Boy Scouting he keeps busy learning such skills as first aid, signaling, cooking, and camping while learning many traits of good citizenship. This is a program of advancement that is indeed a measurement of a boy's ability to stand on his own two feet.

In order to bring this program to the boys of our area, the Crater Lake Council was organized and chartered by the National Council, Boy Scouts of America in 1924. The responsibility of the Council is to serve existing units, make training available, organize activities, provide camps, supervise the advancement program and extend the use of the program to more boys.

The 1959 Operating Budget of \$45,800 for the Crater Lake Council received careful study by the Budget, the Finance, and the Executive committees of the Council. Final revision and approval was given by the Council Executive Board whose members represent the three counties of the Council.

The final 1959 Operating Budget takes into account the minimum Council needs for executive staff, service, training, camping and other phases of the Council Program. A "fair share" of the 1959 Operating Budget is determined for each county and a similar "fair share" is requested from each United Fund with which the Council is a member-agency. Factors to determine the "fair share" are population, available boys and effective buying income.

This Budget then, as it is met, becomes the Program of the Crater Lake Council. That Program can be carried to boys only so far as the Council Budget is raised.

No payment may be made for disabilities incurred after age 60, and no premium charge is made for this benefit after that date.

If the veteran is in good health and under 60, the rider may be added to any National Service Life Insurance (NSLI) policy, except for a limited number sold to service-disabled veterans since April, 1953, Brannock said.  
Of the 5,650,000 holders of eligible NSLI policies, the Veterans Administration has estimated that at least 5,000,000 could qualify for the rider.  
Information about the total disability income provision is available to NSLI policyholders at the Veterans Administration office, 33 North Riverside ave., Medford.

**Total Disability**  
Payments under the clause begin after the total disability has existed for six consecutive months, and continue for the duration of the disability.
