

Dairy Foods Promotion Planned

Portland—UPI—Dairy farmers from 47 states Thursday planned a national dairy foods advertising and sales promotion program with a budget of \$5 million.

They are attending the annual American Dairy Association executive committee meeting here at the Multnomah hotel.

Most of the budget will be invested in an advertising program for milk. Lyman D. McKee of Madison, Wis., the group's president, said the program was the most comprehensive ever developed by the ADA.
