People Who Have A Cure For Something

I receive many letters from good people who feel that they have found a cure for something or other, or they have a theory about a cure and they want it tried out by the medical profession.

Some are much annoyed because no medical association will test their cure. These people lose faith in the open-mindedness of the medical profession.

Sometimes they say to me, "You seem to be an honest and devoted person, you try it out for me," or "You compel the A.M.A. to try it out."

In almost all cases I fear I, too, will disappoint the man with a cure for cancer or something. Why? It happens often that I can see from a glance at his prescription that he hasn't anything new or anything at all likely to cure the disease that he hopes he can cure.

The chemicals listed in his formula are old and well-known ones which have no cancer-curing properties. In many cases I recognize his prescription as an old one which had already been given up 50 years ago, when my father was a physician. For instance, a supposed new cure for arthritis often contains sulphur—a drug that has been tried again and again for half a century and always given up.

Chances Practically Nil

Actually, today, the chances of some layman's happening on a cure for cancer or tuberculosis or insanity is practically nil. The day for picking up nuggets from the surface of the ground is gone, and today any good drug is almost certain to be the result of years of research by chemists who are experts in the construction of medicines for a certain purpose. To show how difficult the problem is, the first great remedy for syphilis was called 606. Why? Because it was the six hundred and sixth tested by Ehrlich and his fellow chemists as they kept modifying the poison, arsenic, until it would kill the parasites of the disease and not hurt the man who was ill. Not satisfied entirely with this drug, Ehrlich kept at work until he found 914, which in some ways was better than 606.

When, rarely, I do get a letter from someone who has an idea that might conceivably be of some use, I have to point out to the man that he cannot get anywhere unless men who are highly expert in the particular field of drug research feel that he has something worth spending time on. For instance, if a man thinks he has a cure for cancer, there is no sense in appealing to me about it. I am not an expert in this field.

Let him send his drug, with details, to the great Sloan Kettering Research Laboratory in New York City, or to the great U. S. Research Hospital at Bethesda, Maryland. The experts there can probably tell at a glance whether the stuff is worth spending 10 minutes on. If they don't care to study it, it is not because they have any prejudice against it; it is simply because they do not care to waste time.

Many people write to tell me that their pet quack's cancer cure has not been investigated by the government.

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as it should be. Actually, I am almost certain that the writer is wrong, because the government chemists quickly find out what is in a quack's medicine; it is their business to know this. Always, so far, they have found either plain water or some herb or some simple chemical or simple laxative which couldn't possibly cure anything.

Would Need Police Help

I remember once when a wealthy woman patient of mine said she was annoyed because her gardener had discovered a cure for cancer, and the medical profession would not test it. She wanted me to help the gardener. I said to her, "If your gardener really has a cure for cancer and can definitely cure half a dozen persons with cancer that has scattered throughout the person's body, he won't need any help from me or the medical profession; he'll soon get help from the police. He'll need their help to keep hundreds of people from swarming into his house through the doors and windows."

I can remember when an old doctor friend of mine thought he had discovered the cure for cancer. Like a good physician (not a quack) he started testing it without charge on the people who wanted to try it. Within a few weeks he was besieged by hundreds of people who had come from all over the United States. In order to help them, he and his assistant worked day and night trying to make enough of the stuff so that they could treat the multitude. When it soon became obvious that the treatment was not working, the crowd melted away, leaving the poor old doctor brokenhearted.

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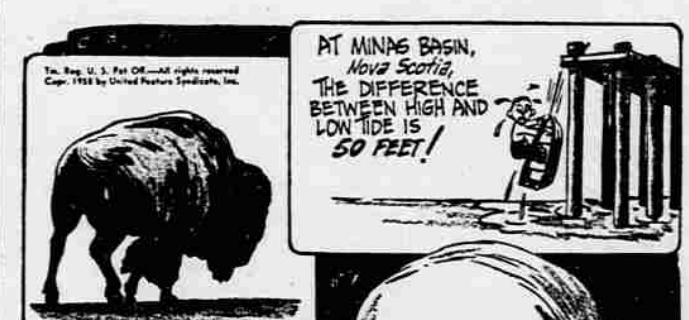
