Hatfield Charges 'Hatchet Man' Use

Newport, Ore. (UPI)—Secretary of State Mark Hatfield, Republican nominee for governor, has accused Gov. Robert D. Holmes of "refusing to answer many questions" regarding his administration. Instead, Hatfield said, the governor has sent "hatchet men" to try to answer or to try to make counter charges.

Hatfield also claimed the governor was using many public employees to promote his candidacy for reelection. Hatfield's charges came in an extemporaneous question and answer period in which he was asked to elaborate on his claims the governor made state appointments on basis of politics rather than ability. Hatfield also said he opposed a state sales tax because it is "regressive."

Standard Reduces Fuel Oil Prices

San Francisco (UPI)—Standard Oil Company of California, Western Operations, Inc., has announced a 35 cents per barrel reduction in its selling price for fuel oil. The decrease equals the 1956 price level, the company said, adding that it also is making major revisions in its buying price for heavy crude oils.

Fuel oil is derived mainly from heavy crude oils. The company said the reduction was caused principally by the "displacement of fuel oil by natural gas imported in increasing volume from outside California, Oregon and Washington."

De Gaulle Calls Cabinet To Draft Algerian Action

Paris (UPI)—Premier Charles de Gaulle, confirmed by Sunday's referendum as the undisputed master of France, summoned his cabinet Tuesday to lay the foundation of the Fifth Republic and to map stern measures against Algerian terrorism in France.

The government was expected to begin work at once on the law which will govern the election of the new republic's first parliament. It was expected to scrap the proportional representation system of voting which gave splinter parties so much influence on the Fourth Republic.

Plans for other sweeping reforms also seemed certain to be discussed at today's cabinet meeting. De Gaulle must devise means of dealing with pressing problems left over from the Fourth Republic, notably the guerrilla war in Algeria and the Arab terror campaign in France.

He will spend Thursday and Friday in Algeria discussing details of a "new deal" program he plans to offer Arab residents as a means of ending the war.

Algeria's 97 per cent vote for the new constitution—larger even than the four-to-one majority that supported De Gaulle in France—appeared to indicate good prospects for success. At home, the cabinet was believed to be considering a drastic crackdown on Arabs held responsible for the current campaign of sabotage and murder.

Engineering Firms Want Air Device, Missing Inventor

Los Angeles (UPI)—Two multi-million dollar engineering companies today were involved in a tug-of-war over a device invented by Elmer C. Meukel, 41-year-old penniless inventor who was forced to leave his family more than three months ago to seek work and hasn't been seen since.

Both Polaris and Regulus engineering companies want the device—and Meukel. They said if he can perfect his invention it would protect airplanes from in-flight collisions.

Frederick Hagelstein, vice president of Regulus, said his company has already spent \$1 million on the device and is only two months away from perfecting it. Can Go Ahead.

"If we can contact Meukel and get the information we require," Hagelstein said, "we can go ahead with production."

Officials for Polaris said they could get a multi-million dollar contract from the government for developing the device and that Meukel would receive three per cent in royalties from any money they received.

Mrs. Jean Meukel said her husband left her and their three children June 22 to seek work in Northern California. She said her self-educated husband had spent months working on the device and has used all of the family funds.

He probably has no idea the companies are interested in his invention, Mrs. Meukel said. Meanwhile, Russell M. Hokanson, a friend of Meukel's who was given the device for safe keeping during the inventor's search for work, said he has turned over the device to the police department.

Hokanson said his action was prompted when Ben Radatz, president of Polaris, accompanied by another man, visited him at his home and tried to talk him into turning over the device to them.
