Nov. 10 Set as Brief Deadline In Rate Hearing

San Francisco—UPI—The Interstate Commerce Commission has set Nov. 10 as the deadline for filing of briefs on a proposed reduction in lumber freight rates between Southern Oregon - Northern California and Southern California-Arizona.

ICC Examiner Walter Baumgartner set the deadline Wednesday as 25 days of hearings ended. They were conducted here and in Portland.

Southern Pacific, Santa Fe and Western Pacific railroads asked the ICC for permission to reduce rates more sharply from Southern Oregon than from Northern California in order to restore a parity they said existed before 1954.

The request was opposed by Northern California lumbermen, who said it would give Southern Oregon operators a big competitive advantage. Truck and water shippers also protested the rate cuts, claiming they would put them out of business.

The railroads are led by SP, which received more than \$100 million in revenue from shipping forest products in 1957. They claim that the rate reductions would attract more lumber business.

The ICC has until Dec. 20 to make a decision in the case, or the new rates automatically go into effect.

Truck Hauling Rate Hike Okayed

Salem—UPI—Public Utility Commissioner Howard Morgan Wednesday approved a 6.7 per cent increase on truck hauling rates in Oregon, excepting trucks that haul cement and allied products.

The increase, to become effective Oct. 13, were asked by the Pacific Inland Tariff Bureau. Similar boosts have been granted or are being considered in Washington and California.

Petitions for the increase were based on claims of higher labor and operating costs.

Petition Filed To Change Name

Cave Junction—The city hall will carry a measure to change the name of the city from Cave Junction to Caves City. A signed petition for the change has been submitted to the city recorder.

When the townsites were originally platted and recorded in 1932, the name appearing on the records was Caves City. The inconvenience of closing shop and driving the two miles to Kerby every day for the mail, resulted in a demand for a Caves City post office.

When word finally came through the request had been granted, the event was for a Cave Junction post office. Cave Junction is now an incorporated city and has grown from a small settlement centering around the junction of the Redwood and Caves highways to the largest town in the Illinois valley.

Other petitions submitted to the city recorder for the three city offices to expire this year include Elwood Hussey for mayor, and Bart Jenkins and Mrs. Robert Rausch for councilmen.

Gas Pipeline Permit Approved

Salem—UPI—Public Utility Commissioner Howard Morgan said today the Federal Power Commission has granted Pacific Northwest Pipeline Corporation a temporary certificate to extend a pipeline for natural gas from Klickitat county, Wash., across the Columbia river to The Dalles.

Morgan said he was notified of the certificate by Jerome Kuykendall, FPC chairman, in a telephone call. The commissioner had urged Kuykendall to speed action on the application, which was opposed by the newly-formed Northern Utility Company of The Dalles.

Morgan said it would be necessary to continue distribution of butane at a much higher cost to customers if the application for a temporary permit were not granted. Northwest Natural Gas Company presently serves The Dalles.

Portland Vice Figure Indicted By Grand Jury

Portland—UPI—James B. Elkins, central figure in the 1956-1957 Portland vice probe, was indicted by the Multnomah county grand jury Wednesday on a charge of conspiracy to commit the felony of burglary.

Indicted along with Elkins was Raymond Clark, who also figured prominently in the vice investigation, and five others, three of whom are serving prison terms for burglary.

To Plead Wednesday
Elkins and Clark were released on bail of \$3500 each and were given until next Wednesday to plead or move against the indictment.

Serbian Coal Mine Explosion Kills 10

Belgrade—UPI—An explosion in a Serbian coal mine killed 10 miners and trapped 100 of their fellow workers below ground, it was announced here today.

Officials said the explosion took place Wednesday at Pobjava in the Bulgarian border area of western Serbia.

There was no immediate indication of the condition of the trapped men nor their position within the mine. The announcement said the explosion occurred just as shifts at the mine were changing.

The official announcement said a boiler exploded but gave no further details.

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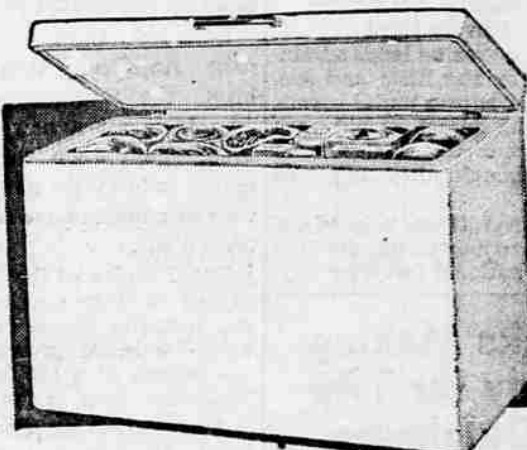
