

Caution Urged by Governor On Eve of Deer Hunt Season

Portland—Upwards of 200,000 Oregon deer hunters, given a green light by Gov. Robert D. Holmes, take to the woods for the opening of the 1958 season Saturday.

Several major timber companies announced that because of the high fire danger their lands would be closed to hunters. This includes some 400,000 acres in the Willamette valley, the coast and in southern Oregon.

Gov. Holmes said the season would open on schedule but he cautioned hunters to be extremely careful in the

woods, made dry again by recent hot weather.

The State Game commission described prospects generally as good. The season runs through Oct. 26.

Willamette Valley Lumber company closed 35,000 acres of the Black Rock tree farm in Polk county and may close another 30,000 acres near the Roaring River and Snow Peak areas.

Valseltz Lumber company said 20,000 acres in Polk and Lincoln counties would be closed. Oregon Pulp and Paper shut down 1,000 acres in the Monument Peak area of Linn county and another 38,000 acres in Polk county near Bald mountain. Pope & Talbot closed its Willamette valley holdings to hunters.

Crown Zellerbach closed the Clackamas tree farm and Wilson river tract of its Tillamook tree farm.
