Several important high school games are scheduled in Oregon this weekend including a clash between two of the top prep powers in the state.

Marshfield, ranked No. 2, in the coaches' poll, goes to Medford to play the No. 3 ranked Black Tornado. This doesn't count in league standings but a lot of prestige is at stake.

Jefferson of Portland, the top team, is expected to have no trouble in disposing of Washington. Madison, rated number four, goes up against Benson in an effort for its fourth straight victory.

North Bend, No. 5, plays host to Coquille, while sixth-ranked Astoria has a tough league date with Beaverton.

Roseburg, No. 7, is at South Eugene; North Salem, No. 8, is at Lebanon; Gresham, No. 9, meets Clackamas and South Salem, No. 10, tangles with The Dalles.

End Lowell Dean, a junior letterman is scheduled to see his first 1958 football action for the Black Tornado this evening when Medford high entertains the Marshfield Pirates in Oregon's biggest prep game of the week end.

Dean was sidelined by surgery before the playing campaign got underway. Coach Fred Spiegelberg reported that the 188-pound flanker will be in the game on a limited scale, probably being used in "spots."

Kick-off time will be 8 p.m. at the Medford stadium and the battle is expected to attract one of the largest grid crowds of the year at the local field.

The Buccaneers of Coos Bay, contending in their first tussle of 1958 on a rival field, go into the struggle as favorites. They piled up lopsided victories over Klamath Falls, Hillsboro and Sweet Home while Medford has decisions over North Salem and David Douglas.

T Against Single Wing
Medford will match an offense which is basically single wing against the wide open split T of the Pirates with its pitch outs, crossbucks and belly series. Tornado overall attack is multiple in nature and can produce some spectacular activity for home fans. Passing is much more a portion of the Coos Bay offense but the Medfordites use the aerial means of advance as

an element of surprise.

Halfbacks Walt Hunter and Gary Rossi are main threats in the speedy Marshfield running attack while quarterback Bob Burke is the principal passer. Halfbacks Ron Reich, Gerry Lyons and Don Peek and Fullback Skip Bennett are big running guns for the Tornado.

Tonight's game is no league in nature since Medford is in District 6 and Marshfield in District 5 but the high rating of the two clubs gives the contest stature.

Coach Spiegelberg said this morning that the Tornado appears as ready as it can be. Medford will be fired by the fact that Marshfield has not lost to a Tornado team since 1947.

UCLA To Learn Whether Beavers Sleeping Giants

Corvallis - UPD - Is Oregon State a sleeping giant due to wake up soon or do the Beavers simply not "have it" this year? That question could be answered here Saturday afternoon when Coach Tommy Prothro's Beavers meet UCLA in a Pacific Coast Conference football game starting at 1:30 p.m.

Oregon State lost 21-0 to Southern California and then looked sluggish in winning 12-0 from Kansas. UCLA, after an opening 27-6 defeat by Pittsburg, bounced back to down Illinois 18-14 last Saturday.

Prothro has been drilling his team in secret this week and is expected to come up with some new offensive formations against the Bruins. Grimm Mason the tailback who scored both touchdowns against Kansas was injured in that game and got off crutches only Wednesday.

Other Beavers, including lineman Sonny Sanchez, Jim Brackins and Ted Bates, have been slowed by injuries. **Overnight Stay**
UCLA, which flies into Salem this afternoon for an overnight stay, has what Prothro calls one of the best

teams on the coast in the last three or four seasons. The lineup includes end Dick Wallen and tackle Bill Leska, two of the best in Bruin history.

Like Oregon State, UCLA is deep in single wing tailbacks with Don Long expected to get the starting call.

USC Tussles Tar Heel Footballers

The North Carolina Tar Heels hope Horace Greeley's advice to go west will help them bounce back from a poor season's start with an upset over Southern California in tonight's top college football game.

Coach Jim Tatum's North Carolinians will be a seven-point underdog for the Los Angeles Memorial Coliseum clash. The Tar Heels lost to Clemson, 26-21, last week, and dropped a 21-14 contest to North Carolina State in their opener.

The Southern California Trojans, with probably their best team in several seasons, white-washed Oregon State, 21-0, in their opener and dropped a close one to Michigan, 20-19, last week.

George Washington, with a game postponed last week by hurricane Helene, takes on Southern Conference host Furman in the only other major game tonight.

Top Three Play
On Saturday, three of the nation's top team - Army, Notre Dame and Pittsburgh-engage tough opponents.

Coach Earl Blaik's fifth-ranked Army eleven, employing a new "pro-type" style of offense, rules a 10-point choice against visiting Penn State in the top game of the East.

Notre Dame, ranked sixth nationally, hits the Texas trail with a visit to Dallas for an inter-sectional encounter with Southern Methodist.

Pittsburgh, displaying a wide-open game and a powerful line, seeks its third straight of the season with a meeting against Minnesota at Minneapolis.

Top-ranked Oklahoma is a 21-point favorite over visiting Oregon in another inter-sectional clash and Michigan State, second-ranked, rules a 13-point choice against visiting Michigan in a Big Ten outing.
