

HORN BROOK Youngster Flies Plane

Hornbrook — "Probably the youngest boy in the country ever to fly a twin-engine plane" was the opinion voiced last week here by Dr. John T. Ealy, prominent Los Angeles bone surgeon, when he took Lornie Paine up in his Piper Apache, and, under his directions, allowed Lornie to handle the controls for 30 minutes in a flight over the Hornbrook and Yreka areas.

Lornie is a beginning freshman at Yreka High school. Dr. Ealy, along with Dr. Harvey, Dr. Bob Harmon and Ed Bergen, an attorney, all from the Los Angeles area, flew here in Dr. Ealy's plane on a buck-hunting trip, and made their headquarters at the home of Lornie's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Lauran Paine, who are long-time friends of Dr. Ealy. The buck-hunting was successful.

The crew of every station in the county, including Hornbrook, of the California division of forestry, was kept busy for several hours on Saturday by a grass and brush fire on Little Bogus mountain.

The fire, which was plainly visible in Hornbrook, covered an area of 650 acres. It was first reported about 3:30 p.m., and was under control about 7:30 p.m., although the flames continued to eat away at the brush for several hours longer. The fire was believed by authorities to have been caused by hunters.

The California division of forestry and the forest service are asking campers and hunters to be extra careful with smokes and campfires. They state that fire danger is extreme in the tinder-dry forest and rangelands.

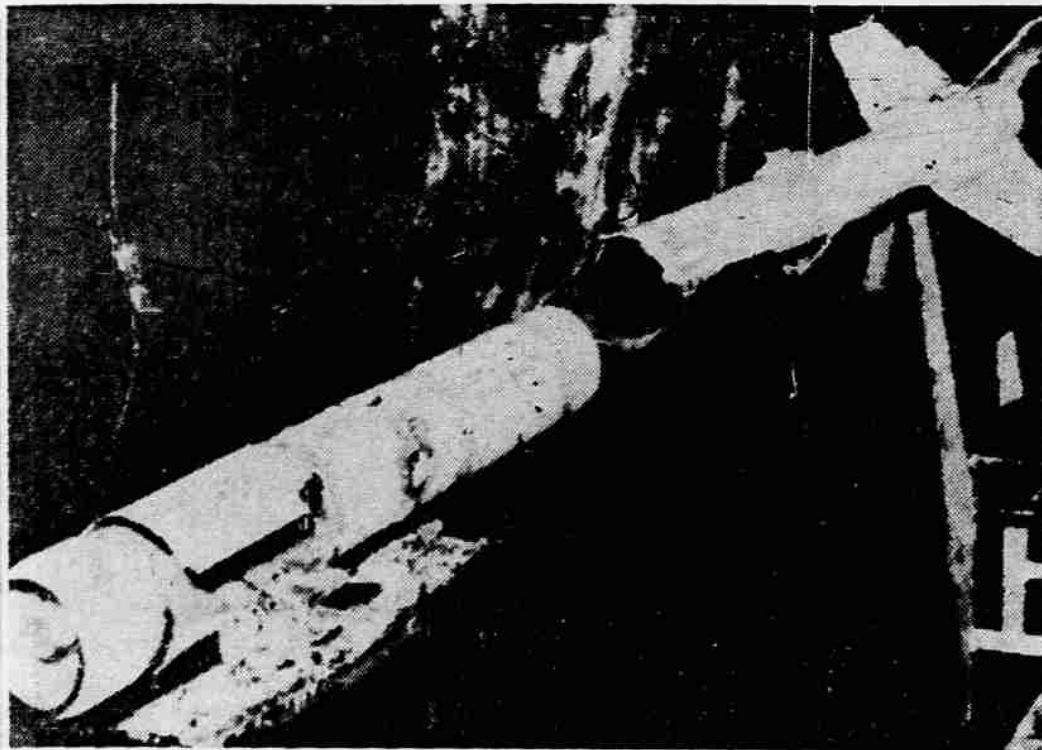

Fifteen members and two guests attended the regular meeting of the Women's Society of the local Methodist church last Thursday. This was the largest gathering in several years.

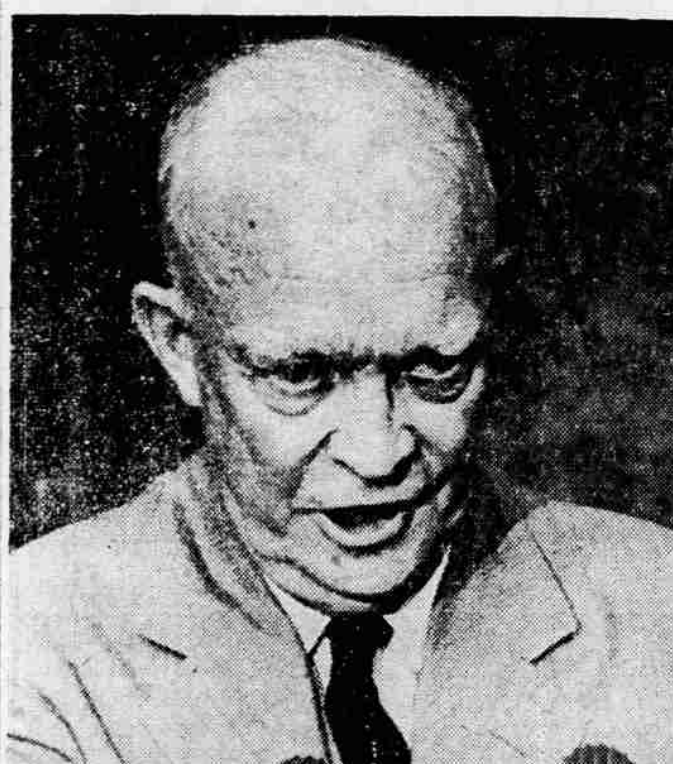
Plans were completed for the annual bazaar which will be held Oct. 23 at the church. The election day dinner was discussed, and committees appointed.

COURTS MUST BE OBEYED—President Eisenhower, at his news conference in Washington, said it is incumbent on officials of Arkansas and Virginia, along with all other Americans, to comply with federal court rulings on public school integration. The President also said this country would continue to oppose Communist expansion in the Far East. He said that while it was debatable whether the demilitarization of Quemoy after a Communist cease-fire might be negotiated, he thought that the maintenance of large Chinese Nationalist forces on Quemoy for an extended period was unwise.

Deck Officers Continue Strike

New York—(UPI)—A deck officer's strike entered its third day today with the nation's two largest luxury liners stuck in port and thousands of tourists stranded on both sides of the Atlantic.

The United States Lines Thursday cancelled the sailings for Europe of the United States and the America because of the walkout by the International Union of Masters, Mates and Pilots.

If a settlement is not reached soon, more than 300 ships could be tied up at East and Gulf Coast ports.

It was the first cancellation in her six-year career for the super-liner United States and the second for the America. About 2,600 passengers here were affected.

All told, the company said, about 5,000 potential passengers at both ends of the Atlantic run must seek other means of transportation.

The strike followed a breakdown in negotiations between the union and the American Merchant Marine Institute, representing 21 major firms. Side benefits, rather than wages, were the disputed issues.

BLOCKADE A MYTH?—George Yeh, new Nationalist Chinese Ambassador to the U. S., told newsmen at the White House in Washington that he thought the Communists' artillery blockade of Quemoy had been proved a "myth." The envoy said the Nationalists, with U. S. aid, would continue to lick Communist efforts to choke off the offshore islands. Meanwhile, China's Ambassador to the UN said his country would seek to recover the Chinese mainland through a people's revolt against the regime.

Vice Overlord's Wealth Investigated

Chicago—(UPI)—FBI agents today sought possible tie-ins between the wealth of a suspected vice overlord and Las Vegas gambling houses.

The agents disclosed Thursday that a dozen plane ticket stubs for Las Vegas were found in the fire-blackened apartment where Robert Mulroy, 37, died Monday. Among his belongings were photographs taken at Las Vegas gambling spots.

Little was known of Mulroy other than that he lived in comfort with his wife in one apartment while paying rent on another flat occupied by an admitted "party girl," platinum blonde Ruby Webb. Mulroy's source of income was unknown by investigators who said notebooks found in his flat indicated he was the key figure in a far-flung call girl ring.
