DeGaulle Tours Algeria, Corsica

Ajaccio, Corsica - (UPI) - Premier Charles de Gaulle yesterday toured this Mediterranean island where a paratroop-led uprising last spring helped restore him to power in France.

De Gaulle flew to Napoleon's birthplace from Constantine, Algeria, where he called on rebels to lay down their arms and work with France on a five-year "new deal" plan for Algeria.

De Gaulle offered the rebels, who have been fighting for independence for nearly four years, a social and economic blueprint. He said details of a political plan for Algeria's future would come later.

French settlers in Algeria were reported angry with the proposals as set forth by De Gaulle. But there was no indication their dissatisfaction would flare into open revolt, according to reports from Algeria.
