**England Coins Used In America After 1776**

Right after American Independence was acknowledged by England in 1783, some enterprising Britishers started turning out coins, medals and medallions of various types to be sold to Americans. Some were made simply for sale as souvenirs or mementoes of Washington. Others were made as patterns for proposed coins, the makers hoping to get substantial orders on the basis of their proposals.

How many types of these were made no one knows, but enough of them have been discovered to indicate that the true number will probably never be known.

Recently I saw a new variant of what is known as the "Immune Colombia" piece. This copper piece, struck in 1785, gets its name from those two Latin words appearing on the obverse side. The words are separated by a Liberty cap mounted on the end

One of the more interesting things about stamp collecting is that just as soon as you think you've finally heard of every country in the world, you learn of another one.

**COIN-GLASS EPERGNES MADE CENTERPIECES**

An epergne is a centerpiece, a type of dish that has several shallow divided compartments that are usually used for holding nuts and candies.

And so, when a group of us sat down at a table, I was somewhat surprised to notice two of them.

"They're ashtrays," our host said when I asked why they were empty. "And if you'll look close at them, I'm sure you will agree they are particularly appropriate to the occasion."

They certainly were, even though the maker had never envisioned their being put to such a use. On the sides of the dish, at the corners, were the facsimiles of coins in the glass. They were quarters, exact reproductions of those issued in 1892. They were frosted, furthermore, an effect obtained by the use of an acid and which looks just as the word suggests. Except for the coins the rest of the piece was in clear glass.

Since coin glass, as that with this type of design is known, is much sought after by collectors, I was curious as to how our host happened to have two pieces.

"One belongs to my wife," he said. "As for the other, he had picked it up a few days before in a salvage shop, and for only \$3.

He had picked up an epergne of coin glass — worth \$100 of anyone's money — for only \$3.
