Chicago—UPI—Even in victory, Woody Hayes couldn't find much good to say about his defending national champion Ohio State football team in his weekly appearance at the United Press coaches' "Wailing Wall" today.

As bad as we looked, we managed to win because we kept pressure on them," he said. "Our blocking was not up to standard. It hasn't been all fall. There was nothing scintillating about that game. We didn't make as many mistakes as they did. We weren't as good as we were a week ago. We didn't get off to a good start and we didn't have the poise to get out of trouble."

## Hunters Advised To Handle Carcasses in Way to Assure Locker Plants Will Accept

Salem—Hunters may run into a snag in finding a place to have their deer and elk processed if they do not handle the carcasses properly in the field, according to Dr. William L. Searles, acting supervisor of state meat inspection with the state department of agriculture.

Meet sanitation requirements if they will: 1. Skin the deer as soon as possible after the kill. 2. Clean it. 3. Cool it out before it is taken in for chilling and cutting.

Chill Room 24 Hours He says game animals taken to locker plants should be identified and placed in the chill room 24 hours previous to cutting.

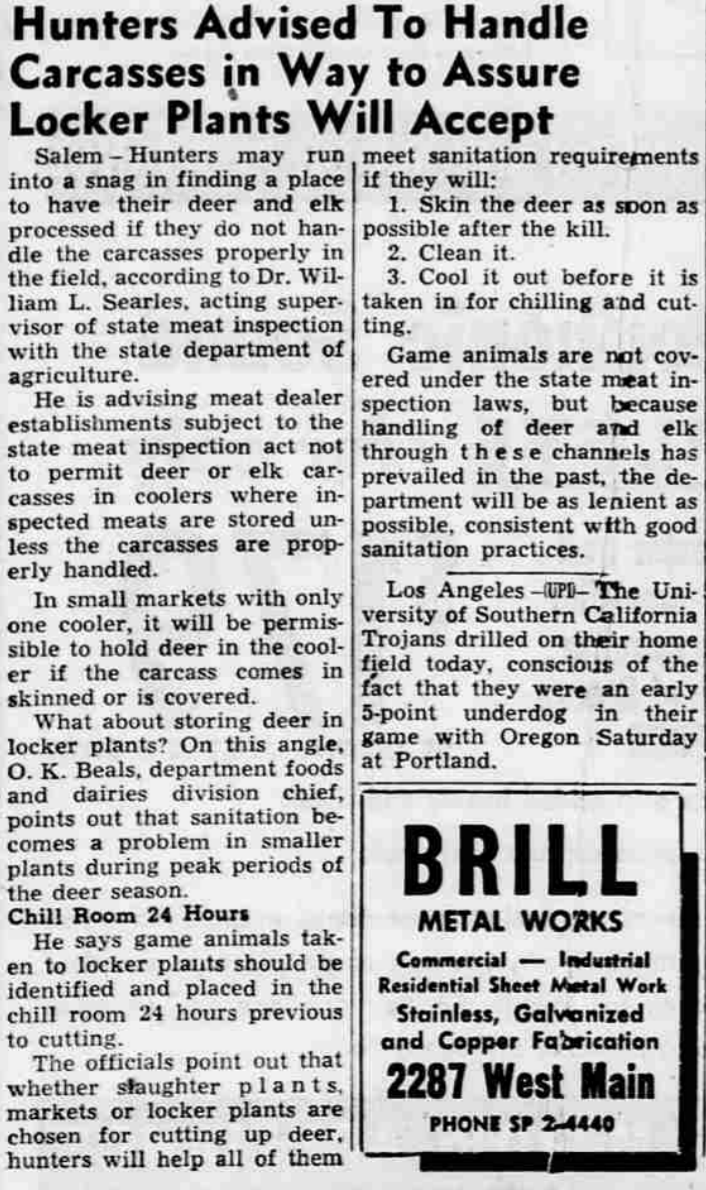
