## American, British Golf Crews Favored in Meet

St. Andrews, Scotland—UPI—The four-man United States golf squad, captained by the immortal Bobby Jones, displayed renewed confidence today as play got underway in the World Amateur team championship.

The Yanks and Britain were regarded as co-favorites for this brand new competition for the Eisenhower Cup, which attracted teams from 29 countries.

Under the special tournament rules adopted by the World Amateur Golf Council, the championship is a 72-hole medal play affair. Each team is permitted to total the scores of its three leading players at the end of each 18-hole round. The cup will be awarded to the team with the lowest aggregate score at the conclusion of Saturday's final round.

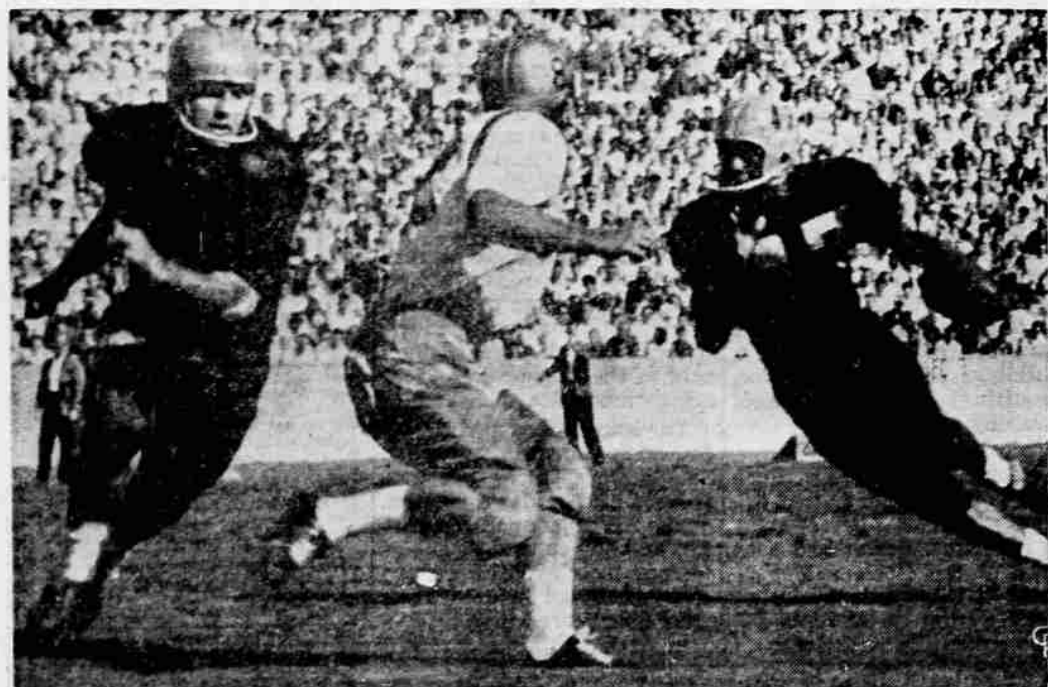

## Oregon Ducks Pace PCC Grid Elevens in Defense

Los Angeles —UPI— University of Oregon's powerful line, which repeatedly stopped Oklahoma last Saturday, gave the Webfoots top honors in three defensive departments, Pacific Coast Conference statistics showed today.

Oregon in two games has allowed but 79.5 yards per game rushing and 56 yards passing for a total defense average of 135.5 yards per game.

Washington State and California shared top honors on offense with California aver-

aging 234 yards per game on the ground while the Cougars averaged 237 yards a game on passes.

Washington State led in total offense with 1173 yards and an average of 391 a game. California was second with 319 yards on total offense while Oregon was third with 318.6.

In other team statistics, Washington led in pass interceptions with six while UCLA led in punting with an average of 41.6 yards.

**Kapp, Newman Head**  
California topped the conference in punt returns with an average of 14 yards and Washington was tops in kickoff returns with an average of 25 yards.

In individual statistics California's Joe Kapp and Washington State's Bob Newman were the top performers. Kapp had 191 yards rushing for an average of 5.1 yards per carry while Newman completed 46 out of 71 passes attempted for 482 yards, enough to give him the total offense lead although he lost 40 yards rushing.

Bill Patton of California led in scoring with 24 points while Gail Cogdill of Washington State was the leading pass receiver with 12 catches good for 367 yards and three touchdowns.

Don Long of UCLA led in punting with an average of 40.6 yards, John Horrillo of Oregon State led in punt returns with 96 yards. Hank Olguin of Cal topped the kickoff return department with 116 yards.

## Falcon Mentor Coach of Week

Colorado Springs, Colo.—UPI—From now on when you talk about the big military academy football teams, be sure to include the Air Force Academy right in there with Army and Navy—because the Falcon's 13-13 tie with Iowa Saturday means they're now a big-time team.

More than 800 Air Force cadets who paid their own way to Iowa City to see the game saluted the new era with a wild celebration on the field.

And United Press International also salutes it today by naming Falcon Coach Ben Martin, one-time two-sport star at Navy, its football "coach of the week."

## Cardinals Issue Ultimatum To Texas Leaguers

Dallas, Tex.—UPI—The St. Louis Cardinals have issued an ultimatum to the Texas league—let Houston climb to Class AAA ball or the Cards will sell it.

Texas league president Dick Butler said he was "naturally" concerned about the ultimatum, but said he thinks "things will be worked out satisfactorily."

The announcement brought to light a meeting scheduled for Memphis, Tenn., Oct. 21-22 for the purpose of studying re-alignment possibilities involving the Class AAA American association and International league, the Class AA Texas league and Southern Association and the Class A South Atlantic and Western leagues.

There has been considerable speculation and agitation recently for both Houston and Dallas to switch to higher classification, possibly in the American association.

## Eddie Cotton To Fight Ray

Louisville, Ky.—UPI—Eddie Cotton, veteran Seattle slugger, shifts from the top to bottom of the leaders' ladder in the light heavyweight division tonight when he fights Young Sonny Ray in a TV 10-rounder.

Cotton, who last fought champion Archie Moore, engages 10th-rated Sonny of Chicago in their nationally televised bout at the Exposition Center.

Despite Cotton's 11 years as a professional and his superior punch, he is a slight underdog at 6-5 because of the suspicion he may be rusty from 11 months of inactivity since he lost a non-title decision to ancient Moore last Nov. 5.

## Virginian Top Gainer In Football

New York —UPI— Reece Whitley, a hard-working quarterback from Virginia, has replaced Dick Bass of College of the Pacific as total offense leader among the nation's major-college football players.

Whitley has handled the ball on running or passing plays 95 times in three games for a gain of 520 yards. Bass, who was idle last week, has been involved in only 42 plays but has accounted for 479 yards in two contests.

According to figures released today by the NCAA service bureau, Whitley, a 5-10, 168-pound senior, has gained most of his yardage by means of passing, in which department he is second in the nation.

In 70 attempts, Whitley has completed 37 aeriels for 459 yards.

Bob Newman of Washington State is third among the total offense leaders with 422 yards, followed by Billy Holsclaw of Virginia (439) and California's Joe Knapp (399). Bass still Way Ahead

Bass, despite the fact he was idle last week end, retained his rushing lead by a wide margin. The fleet-footed halfback has run for 427 yards in 41 attempts.

Don Perkins of New Mexico, who is second, has picked up a comparatively meager total of 276 yards in 45 rushes. The remainder of the top five consists of Neil MacLean of Wake Forest (263), Bobby Renn of Florida St. (244) and Bob Ratliff of West Texas St. (242).

Newman has moved into the lead in forward passing. He has completed 46 of 71 attempts for a 64.8 percentage. 482 yards gained and six touchdowns. Whitley, last week's leader, has dropped to second with 37 completions in 70 attempts, followed by Stanford's Dick Norman (29-58), Harold Stephens of Hardin-Simmons (28-47) and Lee Grosscup of Utah (28-53).

**Arizona Is Top Receiver**  
Dave Hibbert, who caught five passes for Arizona last Saturday against Tulsa, has jumped from fourth to first place in pass receiving. He has now nabbed 16 aeriels in three games to lead Virginia's Ulmo Randle by two.

In major team statistics, Army thus far has shown the most powerful as well as the best-balanced attack, while Auburn retained its lead as the best defensive outfit.

The Cadets lead in total offense, are second in scoring, second in passing offense, seventh in total defense and eighth in rushing defense.

Auburn, ranked No. 1, in the nation by the UPI board of coaches, has allowed only 57.0 yards per game to lead in total defense. The Tigers are also first in rushing defense and second to Kentucky in forward pass defense.



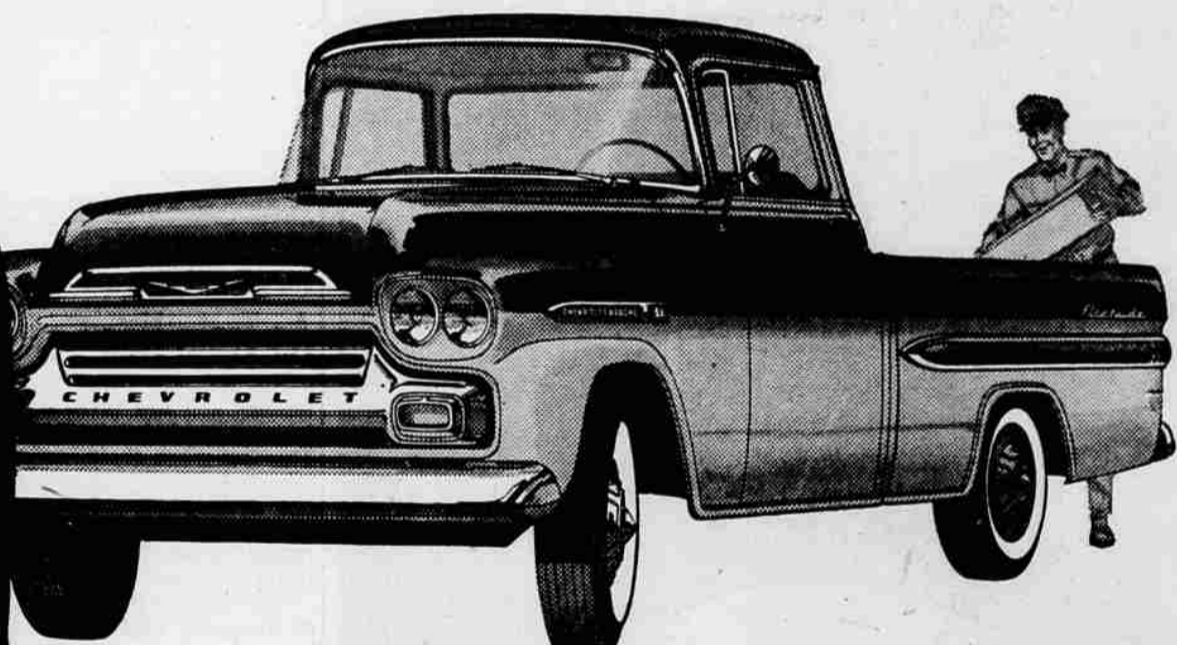
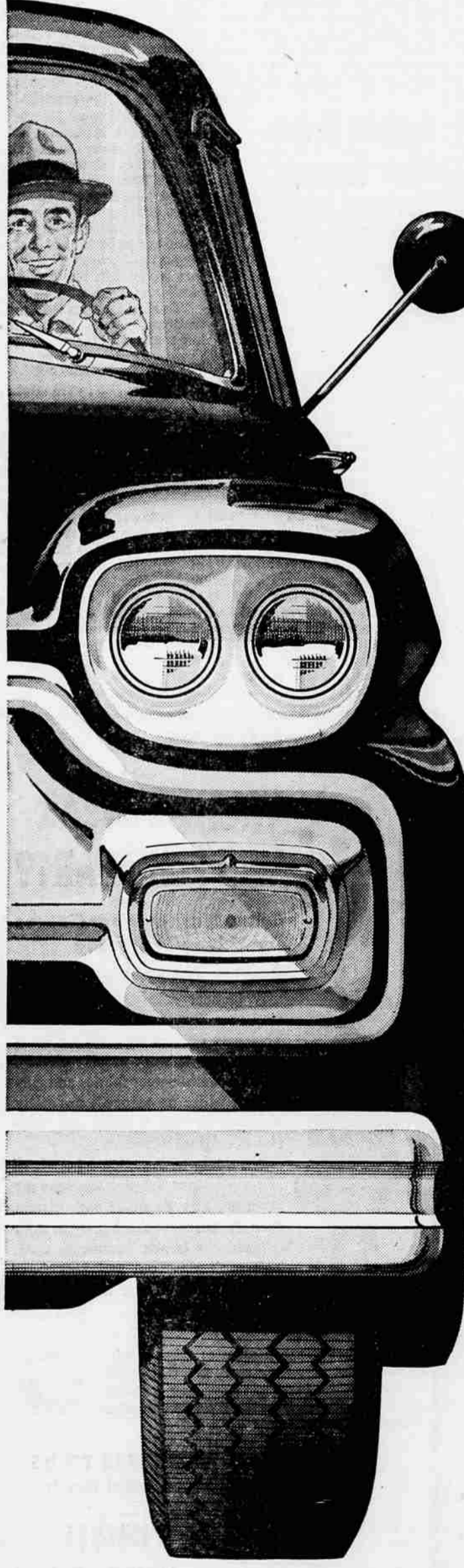
