Underground Test At Nevada Grounds

Las Vegas—(UPI)—Scientists prepared today for detonation of a nuclear device in a chamber 415 feet underground at the atomic test site northwest of this gambling resort.

The detonation, third full-scale test in the Atomic Energy commission's fall series, was scheduled for 2 p.m. (p.s.t.). It was designed by the University of California's Livermore laboratory.

Rock and earth covering the chamber carved deep in the desert test area was expected to smother most of the radiation and practically all of the sun-hot heat generated by the blast.

The device, called Tamalpais, was designed as a shot in the sub-kiloton range, or less than 1,000 tons of TNT. It was "small" compared to other firings, such as the 1.7 kiloton underground detonation of last year.



















