

Black Tornado Has Role of Favorite in Tangle With Crater

Medford, as usual, will have the favored role Friday night, when it entertains the Crater high Comet football team in Southern Oregon conference action.

The Black Tornado's better record, although it has played one less game, and its prestige gained by victory over high-ranked Marshfield rate it the choice of the keyed up Comets of Central Point. And Medford's greater depth is a factor in the picking.

The 8 p.m. fracas will be the sixth meeting between the neighboring schools. Med-

ford has won on the four occasions following a stunning victory by Crater in the first hassle between the two schools in 1953.

Big Game For Comets

But the Tornado has always found its Central Point adversary determined and up-set-minded and on two occasions has had to fight back for victory after yielding the first touchdown of the game to Crater. Medford provides the big game of the year for the Comets.

Comet margin of triumph over Medford in 1953 in its first big time football game was 20 to 14. Since then the Black Tornado has won 41 to 19, 37 to 0, 34 to 12 and 40 to 14.

Medford goes into its first 1958 District 6 A-1 engagement with victories behind it of 21 to 7 over North Salem, 19 to 0 over David Douglas and 3 to 0 over Marshfield. Crater, facing its second league opponent has defeated Cottage Grove 19 to 0 and Eagle Point 47 to 13 and has lost to Redmond 27 to 6 and to Grants Pass 26 to 7.

Less Manpower

As in past meetings Crater will enter the Tornado action with much less manpower than the Black Tornado. Ranks of the Comets are thin this season with a number of players having to go on both offense and defense. Medford, however, is just about three-deep at every position and can field separate offensive and defensive platoons.

Medford will match its multiple attack, based around the single wing formation, against the split T of the Central Pointers. Crater's offense is similar in style to that of Marshfield which was on display here last Friday. Passing has a considerable role in the Comet assault. Medford indicated last week that it may make passing more a factor than usual.

The Tornado is trading adversaries with Grants Pass this week and outcomes should give Medford and GP both an idea of what to expect when they take the field against each other on the last Friday of the regular campaign. Grants Pass tackles the tough Marshfield Pirates at Coos Bay.

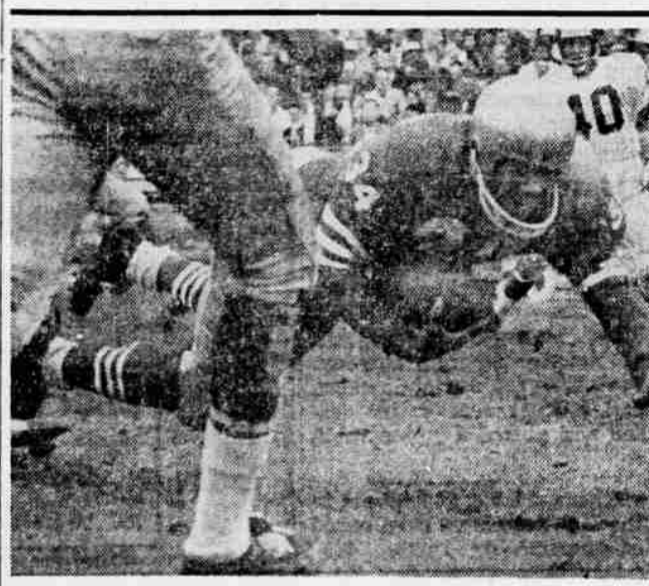

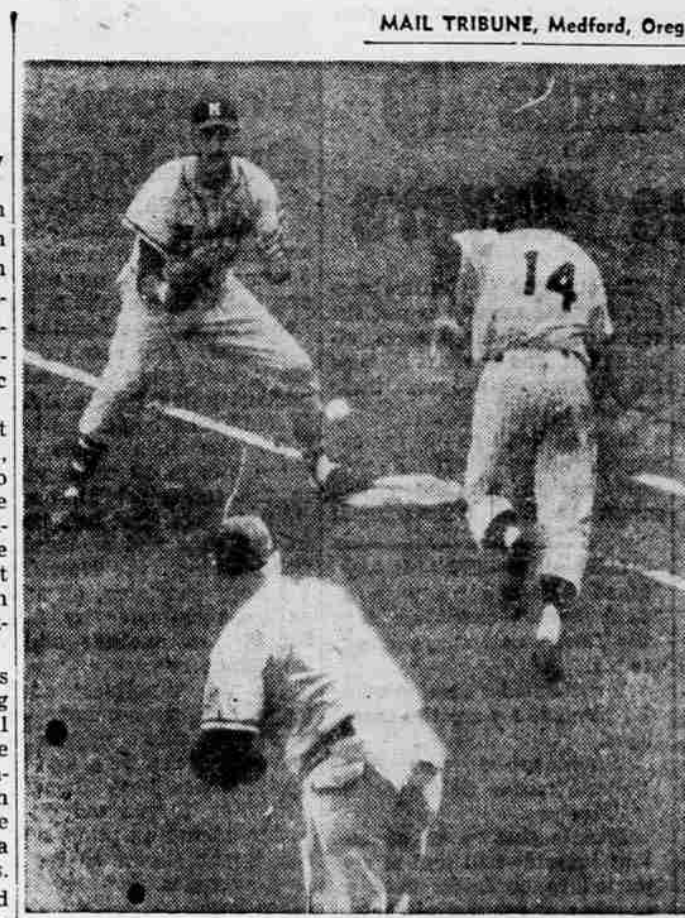
