### Notice Explains Changes In Social Security Law

An important notice is enclosed with the social security checks being delivered this month to the 200,000 disabled workers who are receiving monthly disability insurance benefits, according to W. V. Nusbbaum, manager of the Medford office of the Social Security Administration.

The notice explains a provision in the 1958 amendments to the social security

law under which dependent's benefits may be paid to certain members of his family.

Disability insurance benefits have been payable to severely disabled workers 50 to 65 years of age since July, 1957. These disability payments are equal in amount to the monthly old-age insurance benefits the worker would receive if he were already 65 years of age, but the dependents of these workers have not until now been eligible for payments.

**Paid Same Benefits**

Under the new amendments, the disabled person's dependents will be paid the same benefits they would receive if he were 65 and drawing benefits as a retired worker.

Benefits can be paid to any of his children who are under 18, or who have been totally disabled since before their 18th birthday, and to his wife regardless of her age, if she has in her care children who are eligible for these dependent's benefits. If there is no child in the family eligible for benefits, the wife of a disabled person can qualify for benefits when she reaches 62.

It is estimated that about 180,000 dependents of disabled workers could start collecting benefits, beginning with a payment for September, 1958. Before payment can be made, however, an application must be filed by or on behalf of the eligible dependent, with the nearest social security office.

### Henry Semon Dies at K. Falls

Klamath Falls - (UPI) - Henry Semon, a long-time member of the state Legislature from Klamath county and the acknowledged father of the Klamath basin potato industry, died here Wednesday night. He was 73.

Semon was born in Port Clinton, Ohio, raised on an Ohio farm and educated in the public schools there. He moved to the West Coast in 1910 and was the first to gamble on Klamath basin soils and climate as ideal for potato culture. His success in the field, and in the raising of clover seed, marked the origins of the basin's best known products.

Semon was first elected to the state House of Representatives in 1932 and served in every session as a Democrat until 1956 when he ran as an independent and was defeated. He had been in failing health for some months.

Semon suffered a stroke about midnight and was taken to Hillside hospital in Klamath Falls. Survivors include the widow, Halze, and one daughter, Gretchen Thompson.

A son, Charles Henry, was killed in World War II and his father erected a church here in his memory.

### Holmes' Charges Claimed Political

Boise - (UPI) - Idaho Power Company officials Wednesday labeled charges by Gov. Robert D. Holmes of Oregon that the loss of fish had been "catastrophic" during the reactivation of fish trapping facilities at Oxbow dam site as "politically inspired and out of all proportion to the facts."

The power company said about 800 fish had been lost during the reactivation procedure by actual count. It said this indicates the total fish loss will not exceed five per cent of the fish run.

In regards to Holmes' charge of heavy losses to the run, Idaho Power officials said it was "recognized by the company and representatives of federal and state fishery agencies that some loss would be inevitable."

### Picket Lines Set Up at NBC Studios

Hollywood - (UPI) - Comedian Milton Berle's return to television nearly was disrupted Wednesday by a strike of broadcast employees and technicians.

Members of the National Association of Broadcasting Employees and Technicians (NABET) were scheduled to walk out in a dispute over a company offer to 30 page boys but delayed the strike 40 minutes to complete Berle's program.

The dispute was over a wage offer to pages which NABET was certified to represent July 17. Picket lines were set up at NBC facilities here and in nearby Burbank. Supervisory crews continued to operate transmission facilities and no interruption of programming was expected.

### Elderly Hunter Dies in Hospital

Tillamook - (UPI) - An elderly deer hunter, Frank Sullivan, rescued after being lost in a rugged wooded area south of here for two days, died in Tillamook General hospital Wednesday about 5:30 p.m.

The 70-year-old hunter had left his home in Tillamook to hunt deer in the dense thickets early Monday morning intending to return the same day.

He was found by search parties Wednesday morning and brought out of the area on a "jury-rigged" stretcher and taken to the hospital in a sheriff's car.

Sullivan had taken no food or water on the hunt and he had no matches. During the two days of his ordeal periodic rain storms blanketed the area.

The hunter told his rescuers when they found him less than two miles from a highway that he had used his last rifle shot early Tuesday trying to attract attention.

He was taken to the hospital suffering from shock, exposure and exhaustion and doctors had held some hope that he might recover. The hospital said he died of a heart ailment complicated by his ordeal.
