Tax Free Tea Party

Far Cry from Boton

Foods editors conferring in New York stepped from the autumnal brilliance of the wharfs of Boston town on Dec. 16, 1938, and "we were there" for the re-enactment of the Boston Tea Party.

Empire Room of the Waldorf had been transformed magically with scenic backdrops. Foods editors were transformed into early Bostonian females wearing mob caps and fichus, seated around tables covered with checkered cloths; the room redolent with the aroma of hot rum tea toddy simmering in a huge caldron.

Amusing handling of the screening of the original Tea Party resulted when the film was run forward, then backward.

Today's fine (tax free) teas come mostly from India, Ceylon and Indonesia.

Basic rule for the making of good tea has not changed, however, through the centuries. The rule: one teaspoonful of tea or one tea bag per cup, freshly boiling water and a three to five minute brewing period remain the essentials for a really good cup of tea. For stronger tea, double the tea, not the brewing time.

Tea accompaniments enjoyed by our fore-fathers remain much the same; hot spicy gingerbread, old-fashioned pound cake, buttermilk biscuits with lemon curd, Sally Lynn tartlets, brandied dates and crystallized orange and grapefruit peel.

Lemon Curd

Highly regarded by our ancestors, we remind readers of this tea-time or any-time topping for toast, scones, biscuits, bread or filling for tarts.

Beat four eggs; add pinch of salt. Stir in two cups sugar, one-fourth cup butter softened at room temperature, one-half cup lemon juice and two tablespoons lemon rind. Blend well. Cook in top of double boiler for 30 minutes, stirring occasionally, until thickened and smooth. Cool at room temperature. Store in refrigerator. Recipe makes 2 1/2 to three cups.

Avocados and Limes

Floridians, talking with foods editors about two of their favorite products, pointed out the special affinity of avocados and limes. The tart-tangy of limes is indeed a flavor booster for any salad, for black bean soup, hot or jellied consommé; adds piquancy to fruits, seafood of all kinds; is well thought of for use in both hot and iced tea, in tomato and fruit juices, in cocktails.

Among the many avocado-lime delights sampled was a frozen avocado mold.

Frozen Avocado Molds

Combine and mix thoroughly one medium avocado, mashed, three tablespoons lime juice, three tablespoons salad oil, one-half teaspoon salt, two tablespoons finely grated cheddar cheese. Spoon into four molds, patting down with back of spoon. Freeze until firm. Remove from molds by dipping in lukewarm water. Arrange on canned pineapple slices placed on bed of lettuce. Top with favorite dressing.

—and Season to Taste

American cooks may be a little vague about what cybernetics, count-down, or monodiscium glutamate is, but the average home-maker knows a product called "Accent". Alfred Politz Research, Inc., polled 5,000 women throughout the country to find their reactions to "monosodium glutamate" sold at retail in the familiar red and white Accent container.

Foods editors were told that

"seasoning is the number one factor in making foods good to eat," in the opinion of 64 percent of homemakers. They rated it above quality of ingredients, type of cooking and proper proportion of ingredients. Incidentally, half of the home cooks interviewed "season to taste"; others, presumably, follow the recipe.

Economy Bright Spot

Visiting with Paul S. Willis, President, Grocery Manufacturers of America, Inc., Willis reminded this reporter that there are many reasons for being optimistic about the future as manufacturers and distributors of food and grocery products plan constructively ahead to keep pace with the growth potential.

It is true that "people do have to eat," but the industry's sales increases have been far greater than can be attributed to population increases and continuous rise in national income. The "plus" growth, says Mr. Willis, is found in new products, improvement of existing products, new uses, convenience and ready-to-serve foods, built-in-kitchen services, increasing variety of products. People are choosing to spend more of their income in the grocery stores.

Important thing, says the industry's spokesman, is that the grocery industry has enjoyed a "steady" growth; nothing erratic about it. Less than 20 years ago the entire food volume consumed in this country totaled \$16 billion. By 1938, this reached the unbelievable total of \$75 billion, with a steady growth potential clearly indicated.

Quick Look at Best Food Buys

Protein foods, so essential to any well planned menu, have many good buys for the careful shopper. Beef continues plentiful with a wide selection of cuts at "good buy" prices. Poultry with emphasis on fryers and turkeys offer possibilities for many a budget-wise meal. Eggs for breakfast and to be incorporated in custards, casseroles, egg nogs, cakes and other dishes are settling in their usual pattern for the season. Large sizes are dropping in price and there should be "specials" in the offering. Cheese is another good protein buy.

Vegetables, Fruits. An abundance of fresh produce available at seasonally right prices. Included are: celery, corn, lettuce and other salad greens, both white and sweet potatoes, tomatoes, green peppers, carrots and onions. Apples, grapes and pears are "solid" items. Melons nearing end of their season.

GM Plans to Use Aluminum Engines

Washington—(UP)—General Motors has warned the nation's iron makers it plans to switch from iron to aluminum engines.

GM engineers refused to set a specific date for the switch. But other automotive sources indicated the new light-weight engines will appear in the 1960 cars. They said the aluminum motors may be used at first just in certain models or as optional equipment.

Dr. Robert F. Thomson of the GM Research Laboratories told the Gray Iron Foundry Society Thursday that the iron industry should "develop new products to replace business it must inevitably lose."
Another speaker, Carl F. Caris of the GM engineering staff, told the National Organization of Foundry Owners that aluminum engines would weigh up to 200 pounds less than the current iron motors. The lighter engines will require less support, lighter tires and lighter brakes, he said.
