 London—(UPI)—British steel production has dropped 11 per cent this year, figures for the first nine months of 1958 issued by the Iron and Steel Board showed today.

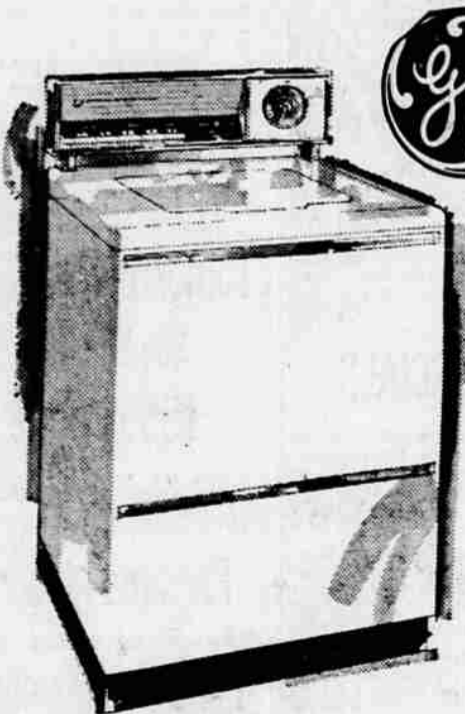

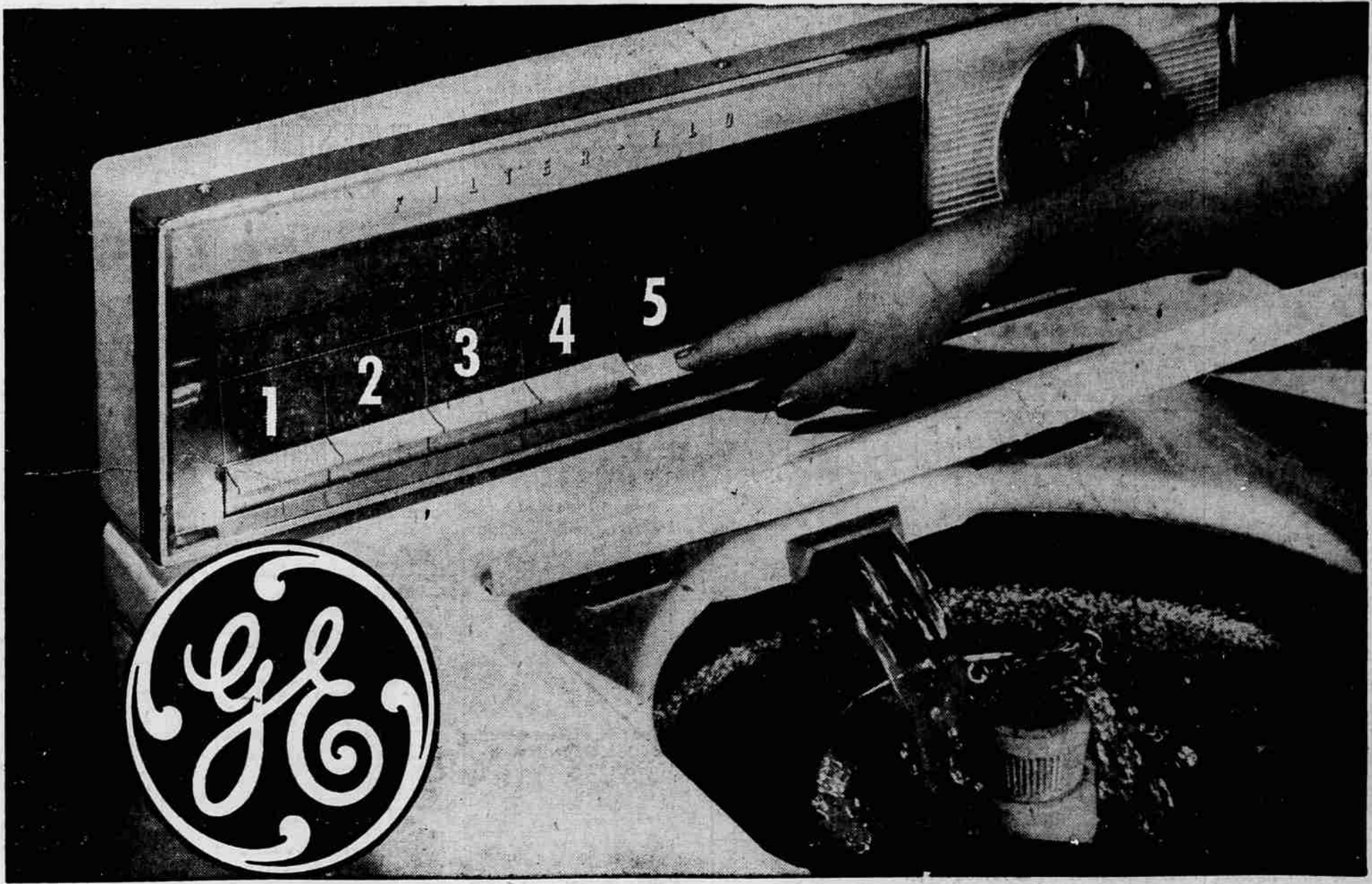
