Chicago - (UPI) - Veteran Y.A. Tittle will be calling the signals today when the San Francisco Forty Niners take the field against the Chicago Bears in a national football league battle.

Jeff Clips Grant 67-0

United Press International Who's going to beat Jefferson?

That was the burning question in Oregon high school football circles today after the defending state champions plastered a 67-0 defeat on Grant in Portland Friday night.

Jeff, ranked No. 1 in the coaches' poll, rolled up a total of 711 yards rushing and passing.

There also was a mild upset in Portland as Cleveland, led by Norm Patera's two touchdowns, came from behind to upset previously unbeaten Madison 19-13.

GP Ties Marshfield Second-ranked Medford kept its slate clean with a 26-0 win over Crater. But Marshfield, ranked third, stubbed its toe again and was held to a 6-8 tie by 14th-ranked Grants Pass.

Roseburg solidified its ranking in the top 10 by downing Springfield 20-13. Roseburg was seventh this week. No. 8 North Salem won as expected over 12th-ranked Corvallis, 20-7; ninth-ranked West Linn walloped St. Helens 40-14 and 10th-ranked Baker came through over The Dalles, 26-12.

District Manager of Insurance Firm Named

Dave Cutting, Grants Pass representative of the Northern Life Insurance company, has assumed the district managerhip in Medford, replacing Jack Burpee.

Cutting, who has been in Grants Pass the past 12 years, plans to move to Medford soon with his wife, Dottie, and children, Steve, Tommie and Jeff.

Tittle got the call over young John Brodie, who had started the game against Los Angeles Rams a week ago — the game in which the Forty Niners took a 33-3 shellacking.

The Bears, who also lost last week, have been installed as 7½ point favorites to win. Return of Billy Wilson at end has improved the chances for the San Francisco club, which took one of its worst beatings in history in that Ram tilt.

"If Tittle can keep the ball moving, he'll be in all the way," says Coach Frankie Albert. "But if he doesn't, it is probable that Brodie will see action, too."

Tittle claims that he can make the team move much easier when Wilson, leading pass catcher in the league the last two years, is in there as a target.

With Tittle in the backfield will be Joe Perry at fullback and Hugh McElhenney and R. C. Owens at halves.

The problem for San Francisco will be to stop the crop of fleet backs that Coach George Hallas will turn loose. These include Willie Gallimore, Rick Casares, J. C. Caroline and Johnny Morris, the latter a rookie from Santa Barbara, who was a college track star.

A capacity crowd of 41,000 is expected to see the battle.

Air Force Gets Victory

Denver - (UPI) - Rich Mayo, quarterbacking the second unit, guided the Air Force Academy to a 36-6 triumph over Colorado State university Saturday with a brilliant display of ball control.

A crowd of 17,500 watched the Cadets, who last week shocked Iowa with a 13-13 tie, overpower Saturday's previously undefeated opponent in the second half.

The 19-year-old Mayo, of Eureka, Calif., scored once and passed for another touchdown, and was running the team when the Academy scored its first three touchdowns.

Wildcats Beat Down Gophers

Minneapolis - (UPI) - Northwestern's fantastic sophomore, Dick Thornton, scored a touchdown with 58 seconds to play to give the fighting wildcats a 7-3 victory over Minnesota in the big ten opener for both teams Saturday.

The triple threat quarterback punched over from the 2 for the winning touchdown and kicked the extra point to make it an all-Thornton ball game.

A crowd of 56,061, including former President Harry S. Truman, watched Thornton pass and run for nearly 150 yards.

The Northwestern win ended one of Minnesota's best line performances in the five-year tenure of Coach Murray Warmath. The veteran Gopher linemen contained the Wildcats' feared speed for more than 59 minutes only to have Thornton pull out the victory.

Navy Breaks Michigan Win Streak

Ann Arbor, Mich. - (UPI) - Joe Tranchini fired a 36-yard touchdown pass to halfback Dick Zembruski with 5:05 to play Saturday to give unbeaten Navy a stunning 20-14 upset victory over previously unbeaten Michigan.

The middies who had halted Michigan three times within their 10-yard line and five times within the 20, came to life offensively at the third period after the Wolverines had taken a 14-6 lead. Tranchini directed an 85-yard drive for the winning touchdown, hitting Zembruski at the five. No Michigan defender was within 15 yards of him as he went in for the touchdown. Zembruski plunged over right tackle for the extra points to seal Navy's third win in as many starts.

All-Stars Vie At New York

New York - (UPI) - National league baseball returns briefly to New York today when Willie Mays' all-stars meet an American league all-star team managed by Mickey Mantle at Yankee Stadium.

Lefty Billy Pierce of the White Sox and Bob Friend, the Pirates, 22-game winner, will be respective starting pitchers. A crowd of about 26,000 is expected to watch the first baseball all-star game of any kind in the stadium for the past 16 years.

Badgers Get 31-6 Victory

Madison, Wis. - (UPI) - Wisconsin kept its offensive under wraps and bulled its way to an impressive 31-6 over previously unscathed Purdue Saturday, boosting the Badgers' stock in the big ten title race.

Quarterback Dale Hackbart, who scored twice, got the Badgers rolling in the second period with two touchdown drives that broke a 6-6 deadlock and decided the game. Hackbart rolled out around end for gains of 11, 14 and 19 yards on a 66-yard drive and finally plunged over from the one.

An illegal substitution penalty for 15 yards gave Wisconsin a first down on Purdue's 23 shortly before the half and the Badgers rolled to another score.

The Badgers played more cautiously after the intermission. Guard Paul Shwaiko booted an 18-yard field goal in the third period. Reserve fullback Don Weisner intercepted a pass in the flat late in the fourth period and ran 36 yards for the final touchdown of the game.

Ohio State Hits Illini

Champaign, Ill. - (UPI) - Fifth-ranked Ohio State powered to two touchdowns in the third period after a halftime tie to hang up its third season victory and first Big Ten triumph, 19-13, over Illinois before 50,416 fans in Memorial stadium Saturday.

The Buckeye victory hung in the balance until the final seconds as Illinois Quarterback Bob Hickey completed two consecutive passes to move the Illini to the OSU 31 with about 20 second left.

But Hickey missed on three attempts and his fourth aerial effort was intercepted by Ohio State's Russ Bowermaster to end the threat.
