

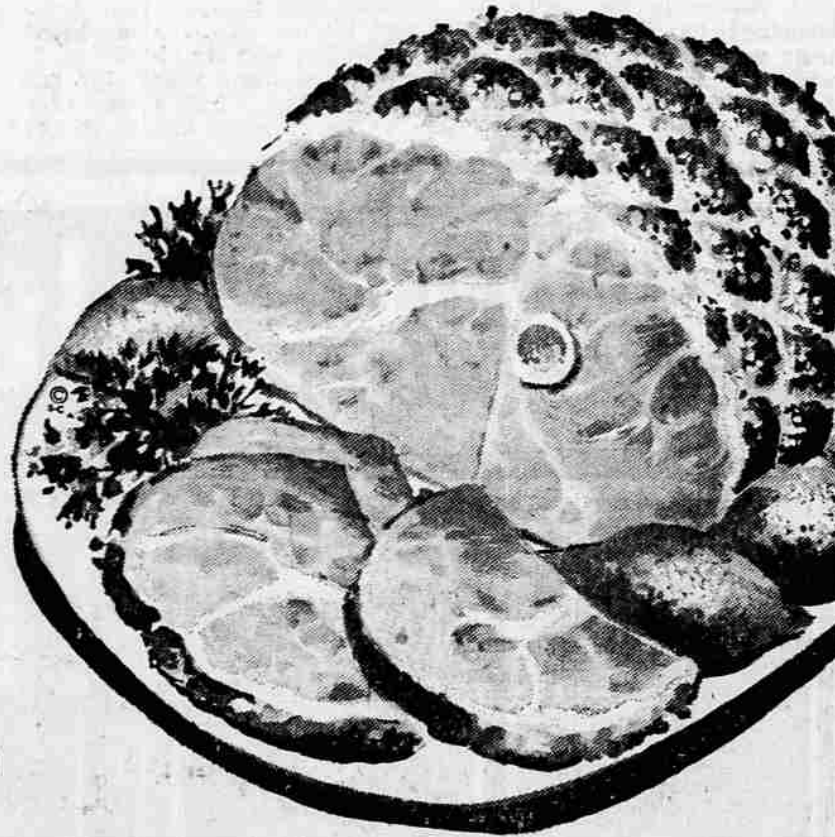

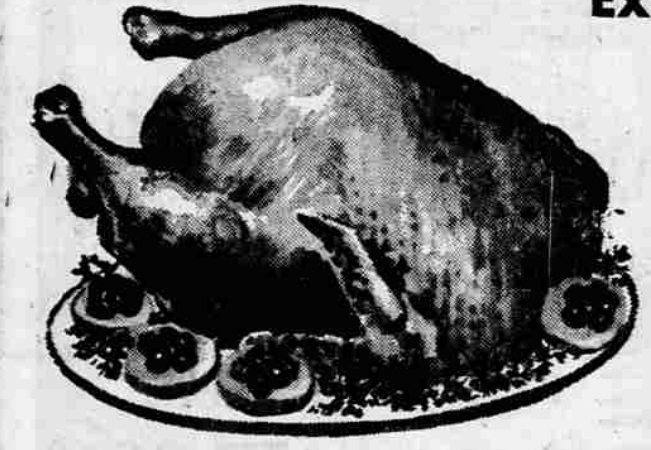

**Backstairs: Ike Sold on Helicopters**

By MERRIMAN SMITH United Press International Washington - (UPI) - Backstairs at the White House: President Eisenhower is finally sold on helicopters as a mode of transportation and he can be expected to use them increasingly the rest of the time he occupies the White House.

His trip to the West Coast Friday will be the first time a president has used the "choppers" on a political tour. In three towns, Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Los Angeles and San Francisco, he'll eliminate the long motorcades from the airports into town by buzzing over the treetops in a whirly-bird.

The White House figures that since most of the missed auto mileage would have been over express highways, the President won't be passing up many spectators.

The helicopters present many problems that won't show up in White House announcements. For one thing, the armed services that provide the choppers must check out a number of flight crews far in advance. The White House will accept only the finest pilots.

The equipment itself must be carefully examined well ahead of time and ferried over appreciable distances in the case of a town like Cedar Rapids.

Where Secret Service agents once had to check only one airport in a town, they now have to make exhaustive security investigations of the airport and the site in town selected as a White House heliport for the day.

The western trip could wear the President completely away from long motorcades through areas where there are no spectators. His reasoning on this trip is that he accomplishes absolutely nothing riding along an arterial thoroughway with no one to greet except the motorcycle policemen breezing along outside his car.

Use of a helicopter means a lot of time saved for the President - and a world of headaches for the people who travel with him, the people who have to rush such things as speaking lecterns, flags and presidential seals to hotels and areas where he is to speak.

The headaches are rather formidable, too, for reporters and photographers who must travel by car upon arrival at the scene of a presidential visit. For security reasons, the White House and the armed forces would not permit the reporters to send a fleet of hired helicopters along in the President's wake. They'll have to get into town ahead of him and race like the dickens to beat him to the speaking site.

The problems posed by helicopters are nothing to what they'll be for many men and women in the White House orbit when the President gets his jet transport plane sometime next year.

Those whose duty it is to follow a president on his travels will have to be transported on his plane, fly a chartered jet transport which may be out of any reasonable financial reach for some time to come, or start out many hours ahead of him.

The type of helicopter currently favored by the President is a nine-passenger job with a crew of three. For the most part on his western swing, he'll be using Navy or Marine Corps machines for his short hops.

These choppers are fine places for solitude, even with a cabin full of people. The noise is so terrific that conversation is too much of a chore to be undertaken in anything but short, loud bursts.

**Section of Mysterious East Squats Among Shopping Section of Fifth Ave.**

The great Takashimaya department store, of Tokyo, Osaka, and Kyoto (annual business volume in Japan, more than \$7,000,000) has invaded America with a Fifth Avenue branch.

If you do your dickering right, you can get a black onaga dori, with a nine-foot tail, already stuffed and mounted on a pedestal to spruce up your living room elegance, for as little as \$1,000.

Onaga dori? That's Japanese for "long-tail rooster." Nobody - but nobody - is going to undersell Takashimaya's on stuffed longtail roosters. If you are willing to take a little shorter tail, there's a seven-footer, white, available for \$750.

**Not Chicken Little** "Those are suggested retail prices," said Michio Kushi, a vice president of the American branch, looking at the nine-and seven-foot perches where the two specimens sat with plumy tails hanging like trails of glory to the floor.

"Chickens," Kushi continued, "have been very celebrated in Japan from the beginning of our history - and the long-tail, ones particularly, which are used for festivals and celebrations. Only one part of Japan makes this chicken, and the long-tails come by selective breeding over hundreds of years. There are only two or three in Japan now with nine-foot tails."

But how can you get the things in your living room? "You can drape the tail like this," Kushi said, making a serpentine motion with his hand, like a multiple-curved S.

**Gaudy Headdresses, Too** The Takashima store, done to the gills in Japanese decor, will be dedicated formally Friday and opened to the public Saturday. At a press preview, some things appeared on sales counters that should give Macy and Gimbel pause.

Atop one counter, the shelves of which contained razor-sharp Japanese hard-steel cooking knives, was a headdress - so outrageously gaudy with brass horns, gold and black crown, rich cloth hangings, and a gold dragon at the forehead that it seemed like a boy's-nightmare space helmet. Price, \$81.95.

"This is called a kabuto," said the salesgirl, a kimonoed chick from Tokyo. "They are made same as original helmets Japanese army officers wore about 600 years ago. Now used for decoration, not wear. Lots of people give these as presents for the first boy is born. Always used for decorate on our May 5 'Oseku' - Boys' Festival."

**Navy Sets Session On Test Failure** Cape Canaveral, Fla. - (UPI) - The Navy was expected to hold a high-level session today on the failure of its latest Polaris test rocket in a limited-power flight.

The 26-foot rocket, an advanced version of the Polaris, burst apart like a jack-in-the-box Wednesday and half of the vehicle streaked low over the cape. Seven seconds later, the range safety officer flipped a switch to cut the flight short and the top section of the rocket exploded and burned in a vacant field.

However, there were no injuries and no property damaged.
