Candidates to Talk Tomorrow At C of C Noon Roundtable

Candidates seeking state legislative offices will speak at Jackson County Chamber of Commerce Roundtable meetings tomorrow and Monday, Oct. 27.

Several questions have been compiled by the chamber and submitted to candidates to answer during a 10-minute period at the noon luncheons. Democratic candidates will visit the Roundtable meeting tomorrow in the Pioneer room of the Jackson hotel. Republican candidates will attend next week's luncheon and answer the same questions.

The questions regard basic issues which may occur at the 1959 Oregon state legislature. The questions were submitted to candidates in advance to allow each candidate the opportunity of examining the issues in order to frame specific answers.

Those seeking legislative offices include Dr. Edwin R. Durno, Republican candidate for state senator; Gordon Hudson, Democratic candidate for state senator; Mrs. Marijane B. Duncan and incumbent Robert B. Duncan, Democratic candidates for representative; and Melvin J. Lattie and Mrs. Evelyn Nye, Republican candidates for representative.

Following are the questions asked of each candidate:
Unemployment Compensation
1. Do you feel that the present unemployment compensation benefits and eligibility requirements should be restricted, remain the same or made more liberal? Why?
2. Would you be in favor of employee contributions to an expanded unemployment compensation program if the issue came up? Why?

3. Do you favor changing the name from Unemployment Compensation to Employment Security? Why?
Improving Oregon's Business Climate
1. Would you favor a proposal permitting manufacturers to include equipment and machinery as a personal property tax off-set against their 6 per cent corporate excise tax and extending this broadened tax off-set privilege to all business firms in Oregon, not just those in manufacturing and food processing? Why?

State Budget and Taxation
1. Do you favor an increase of the state budget over the last biennium?
2. If so, what portions of the budget should be increased and why?
3. If you favor a decrease of the state budget, what services do you think ought to be cut in the interests of economy?
