

Beck's Request for Trial Delay Denied

Tacoma—U.S. District Judge George H. Bolt Monday denied ex-taxmaster boss Dave Beck's request for an indefinite postponement of his income tax evasion trial scheduled for next month in Federal Court here.

Judge Bolt also turned down a request for a pre-trial hearing in which evidence of community bias could be presented.

The judge, in an airmailed decision from Washington, D.C., to the Tacoma court, said, "Further hearings and additional argument would serve no proper or useful purpose, the court being fully

satisfied that the showing made does not justify the continuance applied for."

Beck will go on trial Nov. 10 in Tacoma charged with evading more than \$200,000 in income taxes for 1950-53.

The Person Who Has Lost His Power of Speech

As we all know, many a man who has had a bad stroke has lost his power of speech—either completely or partially. He, perhaps, can only think of the word he wants to use. He may be able to read only with great difficulty, or not at all, or he may have trouble writing. There are several types of aphasia (loss of the power of speech or of writing or of understanding language).

Many a wife of an aphasic man wishes that she knew how to help him find his speech again, and for her a fine book has been written by Dr. Mary C. Longier. It is called "The Manual for the Aphasia Patient" (Macmillan, New York). In it there are 277 pages filled with simple exercises, which can be used to help the patient. I know a man who today fills very well an important position in a large company. Some 30 years ago he had a bad stroke which left him unable to say a word. His devoted wife started teaching him a new word each day, until at last he regained his ability to talk normally.

Democrats Lead Voters in Oregon

Salem—UPI—Democrats will go into the Nov. 4 election with the greatest edge over Republicans in recent years, figures released by the State Elections Division showed Monday.

Since the primary in May, Democrats stretched their lead over Republicans by 17,058 voters for a total registration of 447,195.

Republicans gained only 7,637 since May for a total of 395,090 registered voters. The Democratic edge is 52,105 voters.

The report showed total registration of Democrats, Republicans and Independents to be 855,044 compared with 829,270 in the primary.

In the primary there were 430,137 Democrats and 387,453 Republicans.

Total precincts for the state are 2,719 compared with about 2,678 in the primary. Elections Division Chief Freeman Holmer said he was not positive of the total primary precincts because of mistakes in several counties.

LONG-LIVED LIGHT Morristown, N.J.—UPI—A new exit marker has been developed for aircraft which can provide uninterrupted light for up to 25 years—without an external power source. The new markers, according to the U.S. Radark Corp., are made of glass tubes which are coated internally with a special phosphor and filled with tritium. The tritium excites the phosphor, which then emits light. The best of the markers, according to the firm, are visible at 100 feet or more in the dark.
