**Problem news:**  
In Little Rock Monday, more than 250 white seniors began classes in a makeshift private high school opened by a citizens group. The school, it is asserted, will be financed by private contributions.

More than 3,000 high school students have been idle for the past seven weeks because the four Little Rock high schools have never opened. Arkansas Governor Faubus kept them closed to keep them from being integrated.

**AN EDUCATIONAL** system based on private schools must inevitably limit education to the children of the better-to-do. It can't be otherwise. Neither the state of Arkansas nor the South as a whole can afford to limit education to those of its children whose parents can afford the cost of private schooling. If such a thing is attempted, the South will fall behind the rest of the country.

The world changes. The South must change with it.  
Or take the consequences.

**BACK to politics.**  
If I might be permitted a pious and impartial word about slam-bang politicking in California—in which the GOP is currently expected to take a bad licking—I think the GOP troubles there track back to TOO MUCH POLITICKING by the Republicans last spring.

They gave the appearance then of getting together and deciding among themselves WHO SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO RUN FOR THIS AND WHO SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO RUN FOR THAT. The voters, acting traditionally, didn't like it—regarding the choosing of their officials as THEIR business, rather than the business of the politicians. When the people don't like what is going on, they are apt to give expression to their displeasure in their voting.

**WE HAD** an example of that in Oregon when at the last minute Douglas McKay resigned as Secretary of the Interior and rushed back to Oregon to file for the Republican nomination for U. S. Senator.

He won the nomination by a considerably narrowed majority but lost in the fall to a Democrat. Mr. McKay is a good man, with a long record of excellent service to his state. But it seemed to the voters, under the circumstances, that some political thimble-rigging had been going on back in Washington.

This feeling was reflected in the voting.

**Elizabeth Taylor Sued for Back Rent**

Los Angeles —(UPI)—Actress Elizabeth Taylor, who was believed to have been left a small fortune by her late husband, Mike Todd, Wednesday was charged with failing to pay two months rent on a house at Tucson, Ariz.

The 26-year-old raven-haired beauty whose New York dates with singer Eddie Fisher were reported to have caused the break up of his marriage with Debbie Reynolds was charged with owing \$3,000 in rent for September and October.

Attorney Perry Bertram, who filed the Superior Court suit Wednesday on behalf of M. Prizon, claimed that Miss Taylor agreed to pay \$18,000 for one year's rental of the house where she planned to live after Todd's death in a plane crash last March 21.

**Pittsburgh Hotels Open After Strike**

Pittsburgh —(UPI)—Management of five major Pittsburgh hotels rushed plans today to resume full operations after settlement of a 22-day strike by 2,300 employees.

In a secret ballot vote on Wednesday, the workers agreed by a two to one margin to return to work. They accepted a management offer of pay increases and other benefits in a three-year contract.

The outcome of the vote to end the strike, which had crippled hotel operations and forced cancellation of several major conventions, was learned about 8 p.m.
