Rickover Named Vice Admiral

Washington - (UPI) - President Eisenhower Thursday promoted Rear Ad. Hyman G. Rickover, father of the atomic submarine, to the rank of vice admiral.

Mrs. Anne Wheaton, associate White House news secretary, said Rickover would retain both of his present posts, chief of the naval reactors branch of the Atomic Energy Commission and a assistant chief of the Bureau of Ships for Nuclear Propulsion.

Mrs. Wheaton said the Navy was raising the rank of chief of the reactors branch from rear admiral to vice admiral and that no new vice admiral grades had to be created for Rickover's promotion.

The recess appointment for the controversial admiral must be confirmed by the Senate next year.

There had been considerable doubt in military circles that he would be promoted because of frequent clashes with Navy superiors over the nuclear submarine program.

Mickey Rooney's Firm Defendant in Lawsuit

Los Angeles - (UPI) - Actor Mickey Rooney's company, Mickey Rooney Enterprises, was named a defendant Thursday in a Superior court suit seeking recovery of a \$10,000 loan.

Republic Pictures Corp. filed the suit, charging that the loan was made to Rooney's company in 1956 for production of a television show. The program was never produced nor was the money repaid, the suit charged.

DISABLING SPORTS

Washington - (UPI) - The Air Force reports that 3,222 of its personnel were killed or disabled last year in sports activities. The term "disabled" means lost to duty for one day or more from any type of injury.

Medford Man Forfeits Bail in KF Court

Klamath Falls - Arthur L. Shoemaker, 25, of Medford, forfeited \$50 bail in district court here this week for exchanging a deer tag with his wife.

District Court Judge D. E. Van Vactor said Shoemaker was arrested Oct. 10 on Deep creek road in the Bly area by state police. He was accused of borrowing a deer tag issued to his wife, Judy.

Cheryl Turner Back in School

Hollywood - (UPI) - Lana Turner's daughter, Cheryl, fighting to resume life as just another girl, has begun to attend classes at a public school just six months after she stabbed to death the movie queen's underworld boyfriend, Johnny Stompanato.

Cheryl, 15, is a student at Beverly Hills High school. And she's one of the most popular girls there.

"She's so popular that if you say anything about her, you'd have a hard time getting a date with any girl in school," said a 15-year-old boy who sits near her in one class.

"She's buddies with lots of girls, and they watch out for her."

One of her classmates, a 14-year-old girl, added: "It takes a lot of courage for her to come to a school with nearly 2,000 students. All the kids know it and are very friendly to her."

A coroner's jury ruled Cheryl's stabbing of Stompanato "justifiable homicide." The tall, dark-haired, attractive girl now lives with the actress' mother, Mrs. Mildred Turner, under court order.

New York - (UPI) - New York's Health Department does not foresee a widespread epidemic this year of Asian flu, Morris Greenberg, head of the Bureau of Preventive Diseases, said Thursday.

Payments Now Offered to Widows

A recent law passed by Congress allows payment of a monthly annuity to widows and widowers of certain deceased federal employees, according to the United States civil service commission.

The deceased must have been employed by the government or by the District of Columbia for at least 10 years, including active military service. Death must have occurred before Feb. 29, 1948.

At the time of death, the deceased must have been working in a position in which retirement deductions were being taken from his salary, or must have been retired and receiving annuity checks.

The prospective beneficiary must have been legally married to the deceased at the time of his death and for at least five years prior to that time, must not have remarried since and must not now be receiving any civil service annuity based on the deceased's government service.

If these qualifications are met, anyone wishing to apply should fill out an Application for Death Benefits (standard form 2800). Maximum annuities would be \$63 monthly.

Dr. Kreisman to Speak at Institute

Morris, University of Oregon professor whose topic will be announced at a later date.

Dr. Kreisman also will address the luncheon meeting of the elementary principals attending the institute on a series of topics of general educational import, and on Nov. 10, will speak at the Jackson County Teachers' Institute.

Chrysler Reports Loss Of Over \$45 Million

Detroit - (UPI) - Chrysler Corp. lagging by the recession and lagging auto sales, reported Thursday a nine month net loss of more than \$45 million.

Chrysler President L. L. Colbert blamed the loss on "the low level of automobile demand generally as well as the reduced third quarter production due to the pattern of model changeover in the industry this year."

Mrs. Goldwater said the calls came from one woman and four men. One of the men warned her to "remember what happened to Victor—you'd better watch out for your son."

The reference apparently was to newspaper columnist Victor Riesel who was blinded by an acid thrower following his expose of New York waterfront racketeers.

Paul Sexson, Goldwater's secretary, said the phone calls were part of a series of incidents he believed connected with the senator's campaign. He said the rear door of his apartment was kicked in Sunday night while he was away, but he did not believe anything had been stolen.
