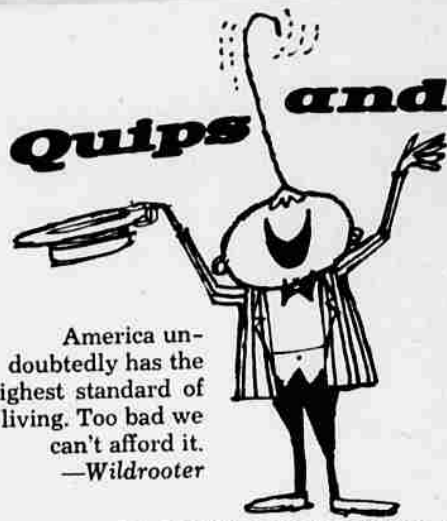

The dirty little boy ran into the kitchen from playing outdoors. "Hey, Ma," he said eagerly. "who am I?"

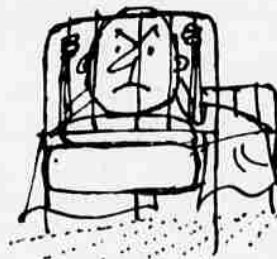
