Sacramento Man Admits Murder Of Two on Coast

Milwaukee, Wis. (UPI)—A young, unemployed cook faced extradition to California today following his confession of two West Coast knife murders.

Milwaukee police said Roy W. Olson, 29, Sacramento, admitted killing John F. Weiler, Seattle, about June 19 and Ogdan Miles, a Sacramento television announcer, Oct. 1.

Olson, who was picked up early Sunday in a Milwaukee tavern for questioning on possession of a pistol, said he stabbed Weiler and Miles because they had made improper advances toward him. Police said this could not be confirmed with West Coast authorities.

Olson agreed to waive extradition to Sacramento, police said. Olson told police he killed Weiler at Weiler's apartment, robbed him of \$7 and took his car, which he abandoned south of Seattle.

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by reasonable agencies and counselors.

Hilda L. — I am drawn toward John. Mrs. E. L. — She has passed up much better prospects.

Hilda L. — I am 29 — the dangerous age, I've been told, for an unmarried woman. I have had some nice men friends and proposals in the past, but for the past year or two I haven't met anyone interesting.

Recently I met a bachelor of 35. He isn't handsome or charming, and he doesn't have too brilliant a future. On top of that, he hasn't treated me with the same respect I have received from other men.

In spite of all this, I find myself very much drawn toward him. He wants to marry me immediately, and if it were not for my own doubts as to whether I'm suffering from "29 panic" I would take him up on it. My parents are very much opposed.

Mrs. E. L. — There is nothing my husband and I want more than to see Hilda married. But we cannot understand why she has chosen this man, out of all the possible men in the world. She has passed up very attractive and successful men. Was it only to settle for someone who can offer her nothing at all?

Airman, Passenger Missing on Search

Nellis AFB, Nev. (UPI)—A Texas airman and an unidentified woman were missing today after taking off in a light plane to join the search for a B25 bomber, missing with its crew of four since last Friday.

The missing man was identified as Airman 1st Class M. Jacobs, 26, Shamrock, Tex. An Air Force spokesman said the woman with him was believed to be a neighbor to whom he had promised a ride in the Piper cub plane while he joined, unofficially, in the search for the missing bomber.

The larger plane disappeared on a flight from Reese Air Force Base, Tex. Missing bomber crew members were identified as: Instructor-pilot 1st Lt. Herman L. John, 22, Tenino, Wash.; pilot 1st Lt. Samuel Goodmitt, 28, Ladysmith, Wis.; co-pilot 1st Lt. Gere T. Pelissier, 27, Mishawaka, Ind.; and crew chief S-Sgt. William B. Dunlap, 23, Hutchinson, Kan.

CHURCHILL VISITS FLEET

Nice, France (UPI)—Sir Winston Churchill took his first helicopter trip Sunday and paid his first visit in seven years to a U. S. warship. A U. S. Navy helicopter carried the former British prime minister, who turns 84 next month, from Nice airport to the aircraft carrier Randolph in the harbor of Cannes where he had lunch with U. S. 6th Fleet commander, Vice Adm. Clarence E. Ekstrom.

LITTLE HOPE HELD FOR MISSING MINERS

Springhill, N. S. (UPI)—Rescue workers tunnelled in three directions deep in the Springhill mine, a tomb for perhaps as many as 93 persons.

There was practically no hope for the 77 missing miners, and it appeared that the final death toll would stand at 93. A total of 16 bodies had been removed by early today. Eighty-one miners escaped, 15 of whom were in serious condition in the hospital.

Officials of the Cumberland Railway and Coal company, which operates the mine, said they were not able to estimate just how long it would take to reach the 13,000-foot face where some 53 men were believed trapped when an earthquake-like jolt or bump crumpled the mine shaft on Thursday night.
