1,710 New Voters Register in County Jackson county had an increase of 1,710 new voters registered in the last 45 days to place it fifth in voter registration increase for this period with other counties in the state. James Redden, Jackson county Democratic central committee chairman, reached this conclusion based on figures released by the secretary of state's office. Jackson county's voter registration increase for that period was even greater than that of Marion county which had a 1,552 voter increase. Top county in registration increase was Multnomah county with 7,500. Lane county was second with 2,375. Clackamas third with 1,830 and Washington county was fourth with 1,783 voter registration increase.
