HORNBROOK School Fence Installed

Dwight E. Salvador, 26, of Yreka, was killed Wednesday when the car he was driving collided with a mule on the Scott river bridge on the Etna-Ft. Jones highway.

A passenger in the car, James D. Hudson, 22, also of Yreka, is in Siskiyou General hospital in Yreka, with critical head injuries.

California highway patrolmen said the car skidded 180 feet after hitting the mule, and overturned, throwing both men out. The car was completely demolished.

Mr. Salvador was born in Yreka in 1932, and was a 1950 graduate of Yreka High school. He is survived by his wife Carole; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Manuel V. Salvador; a sister, Mrs. Alan Clayton, all of Yreka, and a twin brother, Duane E., of Fullerton, Calif.

Funeral services were held at 10 a.m. Friday at St. Joseph's Catholic church in Yreka, with the Rev. Thomas Boland officiating. Interment was in St. Joseph's cemetery, following military rites held at the graveside by the local National Guard unit, in which Salvador was a master sergeant.

During his high school days he was a frequent visitor in the John Shinar home in Hornbrook, and was well-known here. He had been employed by both the Hornbrook Manufacturing company and the Black Mountain Lumber company, and both mills shut down Friday for the funeral services.

New York—(UPI)—The International Association of Machinists postponed a scheduled strike today against Eastern Airlines to consider a new company offer.

The union's Negotiating Committee agreed to submit the offer to the membership following a negotiations session which was adjourned early today. At the same time the union instructed mechanics to continue at their jobs pending a vote on the new offer.

Terms of the offer were not disclosed. A strike would have affected 5,000 mechanics and ground crew members.

Wife of Singer In Suicide Try

Los Angeles—(UPI)—Mary Florsheim Picking Jones, 38, heiress to the Florsheim shoe fortune and wife of singer Allan Jones was in critical condition today after a reported suicide attempt.

Police said she was found unconscious in bed at her Bel-Air home Sunday following an argument with her husband.

Mrs. Jones' daughter, Ellen Picking, who discovered her mother's condition, said her mother and Jones had been drinking and quarreling before her mother went to her

bedroom Saturday at about 11 p.m.

Hospital attendants at the UCLA Medical center said a stomach pump had been used and that Mrs. Jones had been placed in an oxygen tent.

She was still unconscious this morning.

Police said she had taken at least 12 secondal pills following the argument. The couple was married in Las Vegas last December, the day after Jones was divorced from his previous wife, actress Irene Hervey.
