Portland—UPI—A former assistant to Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton in the Portland vice probe took issue Sunday with Thornton's claims of success.

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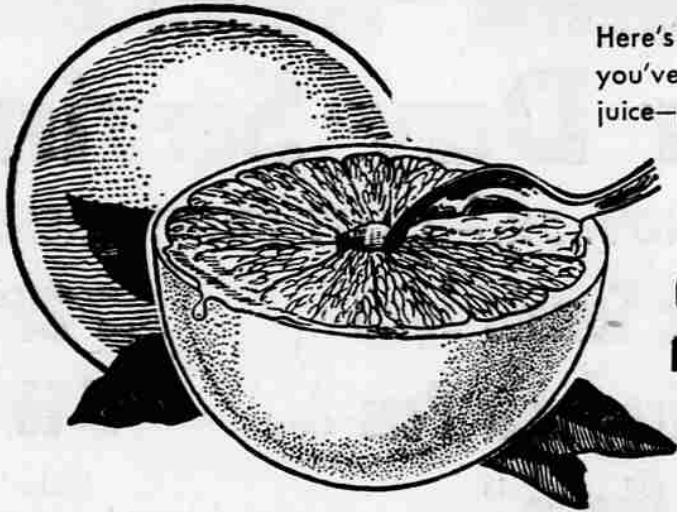
