

## Oregon Democrats Will Have Less Margin in House Control

Portland — (AP) — Oregon Democrats will control the House of Representatives in the 1959 Legislature but by a slimmer margin than last time.

Nearly complete results indicated 33 Democrats had gained seats to 27 Republicans.

There were 36 Democrats and 24 Republicans in the 1957 Legislature.

Multnomah county seated nine Democrats and seven Republicans.

Clackamas county went solidly Democratic in the House and Marion solidly Republican. Lane county seated two Democrats and three Republicans.

Fourteen Republicans and 26 Democrats ran for office again which will make for an experienced House.

## Oregon Lead in Sign Control Seen

Portland—Oregon has an unparalleled opportunity to lead the nation in providing attractive highways for vacationing tourists and for its own citizens, in accordance with the newly-adopted national billboard-control policy, Sen. Richard L. Neuberger told the annual luncheon meeting of the Oregon Roadside Council in Portland Wednesday.

Neuberger, who was the sponsor of the first Federal law in history going beyond highway construction itself to establish a national program of roadside protection, said that "the success of my bill in this session of Congress, after three years of effort, is largely due to the never-say-die spirit of patient and determined citizens' groups in communities throughout the na-

tion.

The Oregon Senator warned against relaxing efforts for billboard regulation now, on the assumption that the battle had been won with passage of the Federal law. "The national policy can be put into effect only by action within each individual state," he explained, "and the fight against the opposition of billboard interests will be even tougher in state legislatures than it was in Congress."
