

# Tornado, Cavemen in 6 A-1 Finale On Grants Pass Turf

Medford's Black Tornado blows into Grants Pass this evening intent on fouting up the weather in the Climate city. A fifth consecutive Oregon Class A-1 football playoff berth is the objective of the Medford storm troops.

The Grants Pass Cavemen and the Black Tornado fight for the District 6 and Southern Oregon conference diadem. Winner will advance into next week end's state

prep quarter-finals and the loser will come to the close of its 1958 gridiron slate.

Grants Pass seeks its first play-off spot since 1953. Medford won clear cut district banners in 1954, 1955 and 1956. The Tornado and Cavemen knotted for the crown last year and Medford moved into the quarter-finals by district vote. The two enter the league finale once more with equal 3-0 district records.

Tonight's winner will be host next Friday or Saturday to the District 5 champ which means probably a second game this season with Marshfield. The Pirates of Coos Bay will be "in" if they kick North Bend tonight. Roseburg is still in the Midcoast loop race but can only tie for the title. This would take an Indian win over Cottage Grove tonight and a Marshfield loss to the NB Bulldogs. And the Pirates likely still would get the district nod on the basis of a 27 to 0 triumph over Roseburg.

Gerry Lyons, who has played at left halfback ahead of Ragsdale and has been the workhorse ball carrier, will play but he wasn't in the starting plans of Coach Fred Spiegelberg this morning. ## Titles Go On Line in Prep Tiffs

The titles go on the line tonight in Oregon high school football action with playoffs just around the corner.

North Salem and Pendleton have clinched a playoff game against each other and the six other spots may be settled before the night is over.

The biggest game in the state sends Medford, second-ranked and unbeaten, to Grants Pass. The winner gets the district 6 crown. Medford is the favorite but the fifth-ranked Cavemen might make it rough.

Both clubs field tough defenses. Medford's platoon has given up only one touchdown in seven games this year while Grants Pass has yielded only four in as many contests.

Should the two clubs deadlock as in 1957 the matter of district representative will be settled on the spot on the basis of total net yardage. This yardage will include rushing, passing, punt and kick-off returns and pass interception runs.

## Alignment Plans Fail

Memphis, Tenn. (UPI)—Plans for a drastic realignment of the minor leagues failed to reach first base today after two days of talks.

Only two concrete developments came out of the meeting. The American association authorized Milwaukee to shift its franchise from Wichita to Louisville and the South Atlantic league added Asheville, N.C., and Columbus, Ga., to its loop.

"But that wasn't realignment," one delegate pointed out. "The Braves merely switched their franchise from one club to another in the same league and Asheville and Columbus didn't have ball clubs last year."

The talks collapsed when the American association tried to get Fort Worth from the Texas league. The Texas league replied: "Take Dallas, Houston and Fort Worth—all three or none at all."

The Bearcats will try to wrap up the Northwest Conference title with a spotless record when they go up against Lewis and Clark.

Two other conference games also are scheduled. College of Idaho goes to Walla Walla to meet Whitman and Pacific is at Linfield.

Stan (King) Solomon of Willamette leads the loop in rushing with 669 yards in 94 carries for a 7.1 average. Charlie Alvaro of College of Idaho tops the passers with 904 yards on 63 completions in 139 attempts. Other leaders include Hank Crawford of Linfield with 24 pass receptions, Keith Driver of Willamette with a 39.2-yard punting average and Solomon with 75 points.

Royce McDaniel of Lewis and Clark was named the top back of last week and Denny Mihm of Willamette the top lineman.
